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

Values


Values are core beliefs or principles that guide the work of the Met Council, our expectations of partnerships, and our policy and program development.

Statement of the Met Council's intent and approach to regional issues or topics, independently and in its roles with partners.

Actions

Specific strategies or activities to implement policies and achieve goals.

DRAFT Land Use Objectives

Original Draft Objectives – Presented on November, 20, 2023

- 1. Minimize the amount of land needed to accommodate regional growth.
- Maximize the development of places accessible for people by transit, bicycling, rolling, and walking.
- 3. Design places where all people feel safe and connected.
- 4. Maximize the preservation and restoration of natural systems at all scales of development.
- 5. Maximize housing choice within communities.
- 6. Remedy past and present discriminatory land use practices.
- 7. Prioritize land use and development patterns that strengthen local climate resilience.



Use available infrastructure capacity in urban and rural service areas efficiently

Reduce the need for infrastructure expansion

Mitigate premature development of agricultural areas and destruction of natural systems

Preserve the agricultural economy and rural lifestyles

Balance the needs of all living things in the region

Encourage density around activity centers and along corridors.

Increase the accessibility of the region for those without access to a personal vehicle.

Reduce the need for vehicle trips and/or their cost and duration.

Reduce GHG emissions related to transportation and land use.

Increase the return on investment for regional transit/bicycling infrastructure.

Increase positive health outcomes due to greater physical activity.

Encourage the creation of spaces to gather, interact, and connect.




