Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council adopt the Facility Plan for the Empire Wastewater Treatment Plant Solids Improvements, MCES Project No. 807400, by formal Council resolution 2013-9 (attached).

Background

The Empire Wastewater Treatment Plant was expanded to 24 mgd liquid treatment capacity in 2006. Solids processing capacity expansion was deferred.

The Facility Plan recommends phased expansion of digestion. Phase 1 of the recommended capital improvements includes the following improvements:

- 1. Conversion of storage digesters to primary digesters to increase primary digestion capacity by 33%, from 18 dtpd to 24 dtpd. Miscellaneous digester system improvements include replacement of heat exchangers and boiler improvements.
- New 650 kW combined heat and power system, with biogas treatment and storage, to convert digester gas to electricity. This system will produce over 1/3 of the plant's power and 2,500 mBTU/hr of heat to the digestion process.
- 3. Biosolids cake storage demonstration and pad drainage improvements to increase utilization of the existing biosolids pad storage.

The estimated capital cost is \$15,000,000.

A public hearing was held on May 30, 2013. The public comment period ended on June 10, 2013. Comments were received and addressed at the public hearing; they involved stormwater management and truck traffic concerns. No other comments were received during the public comment period.

Rationale

Public Facilities Authority (PFA) loan funding eligibility requires formal adoption of the Facility Plan by resolution (attached), following a public hearing on the draft Facility Plan.

Funding

Funds for project planning and design are included in the 2013 Capital Program. MCES will request construction funding for 2014. MCES will pursue PFA funding.

Known Support / Opposition

MCES staff is not aware of opposition to the project.
