



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Proposed Early 2024 Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission Engagement

Timing	Proposed Topics, Focus
January 4, 2024	RDG: Latest timeline, organizational approach. RPPP: Chapters 1 and 2, including existing conditions, regional goals, parks objectives. Focus: Priorities (policies and actions) to achieve objectives.
February 1, 2024	RPPP: Chapters 3 and 4, including System Plan and Siting and Acquisition Policy. Possible focus: Climate adaptation and mitigation.
March 7, 2024	RPPP: Chapters 5 and 6, including Planning and System Protection policies. Possible focus: Operations and maintenance challenge.
April 4, 2024	RPPP : Chapters 7 and 8, including Recreation Activities and Facilities and Finance policies. Possible focus : Demographic changes, completing the system.
May 2, 2024	Focus: Present overview of 60% draft plan.





February 12, 2025	Council adoption








Regional Development Guide – Structure and Goals

Racial inequities and injustices experienced by historically marginalized communities have been eliminated; and all residents and newcomers feel welcome, included, and empowered.

Our Communities are Healthy and Safe

All our region's residents live healthy, productive, and rewarding lives with a sense of security, dignity, and wellbeing.

Our Region is Dynamic and Resilient

Our region meets the opportunities and challenges faced by our communities and the economy including issues of choice, accessibility, and affordability.

We Lead on Addressing Climate Change

We have mitigated greenhouse gas emissions and have adapted to ensure that our communities and systems are resilient to climate impacts.

We Protect and Restore Natural Systems

We protect, integrate, and restore natural systems to protect habitat and ensure a high quality of life for our region

WORKING REGIONAL GOALS

DRAFT PARKS OBJECTIVES

Equity

Better connect people with community, natural, and cultural resources in order to support physical, emotional, and mental well-being.

Infrastructure

People can rely on renewed, repaired, and replaced park and trail infrastructure.

Climate and Natural Systems

Preserve and restore natural systems at regional parks and trails to help build a more resilient region.

Meeting Future Needs

Acquire land and develop new opportunities to meet the region's growing demand for regional parks and trails.

EXISTING PARKS POLICIES

Identify lands with highquality natural resources that are desirable for Regional Parks System activities and put these lands in a protected status, so they will be available for recreational uses and conservation purposes in perpetuity.

Siting and Acquisition

Planning

Promote master planning and help provide integrated resource planning across jurisdictions.

System Protection

Protect public investment in acquisition and development by assuring that every component in the system is able to fully carry out its designated role as long as a need for it can be demonstrated.

Recreation Activities and Facilities

Provide a regional system of recreation opportunities for all residents and visitors while conserving the integrity of the natural resource base within the Regional Parks System on which these opportunities depend.

Finance


Provide adequate and equitable funding for the Regional Parks System units and facilities in a manner that provides the greatest possible benefits to the people of the region.
