Raingardens & Lakeshore Stabilization Using Native Plants

If you live in the Rice Creek Watershed District and are installing a rain garden, or stabilizing your shore with native plantings, you may be eligible for a cost-share grant from the Rice Creek Watershed District. At this moment, the RCWD is not funding wetland buffers or native gardens.

To pursue cost-share grant money from the Rice Creek Watershed District to help pay for the materials for your rain garden or lakeshore stabilization planting project, set up a site visit with [Maria Perez](#). Once your application is approved by the Advisory Committee and the Board of Managers you will receive an [Operations and Maintenance Agreement](#) that needs to be signed, notarized and mailed to our office. Without the reception of this agreement grants are invalid.
