The Purpose of the CAC is to advise the CCMC and provide input and feedback to Central Corridor Project Office staff on issues related to the planning, design and construction of the Central Corridor LRT project. The CAC's monthly meeting will provide an important vehicle for involving community groups in the design process, addressing project area concerns, facilitating public awareness and identifying ways to mitigate construction impacts. The responsibilities of the CAC include:

1. Advising the CCMC on the full range of issues that have a direct community impact, such as station design, parking, accessibility and construction mitigation.
2. Facilitating citizen participation, including efforts to get the businesses and residents involved.
3. Providing feedback to the Central Corridor Communication Steering Committee on the structure and effectiveness of the communication and public involvement efforts.
