MTPD IMMIGRATION Old Policy

• 428.4 ENFORCEMENT

 An officer may detain an individual when there are facts supporting a reasonable suspicion that the individual entered into the United States in violation of a federal criminal law. Federal authorities shall be notified as soon as possible and the detained individual shall be immediately released if the federal authorities do not want the person held. An officer should not detain any individual, for any length of time, for a civil violation of federal immigration laws or a related civil warrant.



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MTPD Immigration Enforcement Policy (05/17)

 It is the policy of the Metro Transit Police Department that all members make personal and professional commitments to equal enforcement of the law and equal service to the public. Confidence in this commitment will increase the effectiveness of this department in protecting and serving the entire community and recognizing the dignity of all persons, regardless of their immigration status.





 The Metro Transit Police Department is concerned for the safety of the public and thus detection of criminal behavior is of primary interest in dealing with any person. The decision to arrest shall be based upon those factors which establish probable cause and not on arbitrary aspects. Race, ethnicity, age, gender, sexual orientation, religion, immigration and socioeconomic status alone are of no bearing on the decision to arrest.





Metro Transit police officers and staff shall not undertake any law enforcement action for the sole purpose of detecting the presence of undocumented person or persons or to verify immigration status, including but not limited to questioning any person or persons about their immigration status. MTPD officers shall not question or detain any person for violations of federal civil immigration laws except when immigration status is an element of the crime or when enforcing 8 U.S.C 1324(**c)**.





ST.Paul City Immigration Policy

- St. Paul Sec. 44.03. Public safety services.
- To the extent permitted by law, in providing public safety services, employees of the police and fire departments, and the city attorney's office - criminal division, (collectively, public safety officials), shall be governed by the following requirements:
- Public safety officials may not undertake any law enforcement action for the sole purpose of detecting the presence of undocumented persons, or to verify immigration status, including but not limited to questioning any person or persons about their immigration status.



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Minneapolis Police Immigration Policy

 Officers shall not independently undertake to approach, interview, interrogate, detain or arrest any suspected illegal alien or refugee when potential violation of the federal immigration law is the principal issue. Neither shall any officer independently seek to ascertain a suspected illegal alien's status aside from the following condition:



DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

 The continued employment or appointment of every member of the Metro Transit Police Department shall be based on conduct that reasonably conforms to the guidelines set forth herein. Failure to meet the guidelines set forth in this policy, whether on- or off-duty, may be cause for disciplinary action (see generally Minn. R. 6700.2000 to Minn. R. 6700.2600).



Discipline by contract includes:

- Disciplinary Option:
 - Oral reprimand
 - Written reprimand
 - Suspension
 - Demotion
 - Termination

 - Tenure of Employee
 - Past violations
 - Same or Similar
 - Past Precedents
