
- Are local governments addressing equity in 2040 Comprehensive Plans?

General Findings




- Broad spectrum for addressing equity in comprehensive plans
- Shared understanding of equity issues in the region
- Themes of "access" and "health"
- Recurring discussion of equity in parks, transportation, and housing elements
- Stronger equity content in Plans from more urbanized communities


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Criteria and Breakdown

Classification	Description
None	No equity terms
Minimal	Minimal use of equity terms
Moderate	Equity terms used in several plan elements, but not integrated throughout the entire Plan
Advanced	Equity terms used in multiple plan elements. May be stated as a guiding principle of the Plan and/or integrated into nearly all plan elements.


