

Background

- Over 7,200 households served
- Anoka and Carver County;
 Suburban Hennepin & Ramsey
 County
 - 96 Communities
- 2022: \$78 million in housing assistance payment



2024 Annual Public Housing Agency (PHA) Plan

Overview

- Required by U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) for any agency administering the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program.
- Serves as a guide and informs HUD, program participants, and the general public of the Metro HRA's mission for serving the needs of low-income families across the region and strategies for addressing those needs.

Long Range Plan

PHA Plan: Five-Year Plan

- Submitted every 5th year
- Currently approved 2020 2024

PURPOSE

 Provide HUD long range goals for meeting the needs of lowincome persons in the region

PHA Plan: Annual Plan

Submitted each year to HUD in October

PURPOSE

- Provide strategies for meeting identified housing goals and needs in the coming year
- Communicate elements of the plan that have been updated or revised

PHA Plan Component



Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Administrative Plan

- Required by HUD as a supporting document to the PHA Plan
- Metro HRA's primary policy document
- Contains mandatory and discretionary policies
- Must be available for public review

Project Based Voucher

What is a Project Based Voucher?

HUD allows PHAs to attach vouchers to specific units rather than using it for tenant-based assistance.



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2024 Annual PHA Plan

2020 Administrative Plan Changes

Project Based Vouchers (PBVs)

- Additional language on considerations
- Timing of PBV offer and award
- Prioritization of developments in the Metro HRA service area
- Policy remains at up to 20% PBV


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Project Based Vouchers

PBV Summary

- 6,839 total Vouchers with PBV option
- HUD allows up to 20% PBV (1367 vouchers)
 - Plus and additional 10% for certain units (683 units)
- 975 PBV units awarded (14%)

Current Voucher Split



- Project Based Vouchers (PBV)
- = Remaining Vouchers available to Project Base
- Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV)

PBV Considerations

HUD does not provide new vouchers for project basing

 Both tenant-based and project-based vouchers come from the same pool of vouchers

PBVs come from a limited supply of turnover vouchers that serve many purposes

- Waiting list applicants
- Waiting list preferences
- Initially filling PBV units and then subsequent PBV unit movers
- Absorbing vouchers from other housing authorities

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2024 Annual PHA Plan

Current Policy PBV up to 20% of vouchers

14% as PBV (975)

- 392 remain before reaching 20%
- Average annual turnover vouchers: 532 vouchers

Policy Request PBV up to 30% of vouchers

- Will not reach 20% in the next few years unless most turnover vouchers are committed to PBV
- Staff capacity cannot support immediate 30% PBV policy growth without shifted priorities
- The PBV resource will be exhausted when the PHA reaches 30% PBV designation

Resident Advisory Board Engagement

Homeownership and Wealth Building

Attendees were interested in learning more about homeownership and other wealth building strategies.

Attendees were interested in workshops, resources, and trusted community resources for wealth building.

Moving with Assistance

Attendees shared that overall experiences with the Metro HRA move process were positive

Attendees recognize that there have been recent updates to rent limits (payment standards) but would like to see further increases.

PHA Plan: Goal Progress





Goal Progress

- Maintained 99% utilization of all vouchers
- Awarded new Foster Youth to Independence Program Vouchers
- Awarded additional Veteran vouchers
- Lunched the Community Choice Demonstration Program
- Received 218 Emergency Housing Vouchers
- Offered 40 Project Based Vouchers to serve veterans and people experiencing homelessness



Homework Starts with Home (HSWH)Ramsey County – 2020

Committed 20 HCVs annually to eligible program participants upon completion of the program to promote housing stability.

Anoka County – 2023

Operate Housing Trust Fund (HTF) Rental Assistance for eligible HSWH households and committed 10 HCVs per grant year to eligible program participants upon completion of the program.


