## **Call to Order**

A quorum being present, Council Chair Zelle called the regular meeting of the Metropolitan Council's Committee of the Whole to order at 4:05 p.m.

### **Agenda Approved**

Council Members did not have any comments or changes to the agenda.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

It was moved by Morales, seconded by Lindstrom to approve the minutes of the August 16, 2023, regular meeting of the Metropolitan Council's Committee of the Whole. **Motion carried**.

#### Information

1. Discussion of Blue Line Extension Capital Grant Agreement and Green Line Extension Funding

Nick Thompson, Deputy General Manager, Capital Programs, shared background and answered questions regarding the METRO Blue Line Extension Capital Grant Agreement and Green Line Extension funding. Thompson began with an overview of transportation finance, new fiscal commitments, and the Regional Sales Tax. Thompson then shared information about the METRO Green Line Extension project costs, schedule, and opening, as well as an overview of the Green Line Extension funding agreement framework. Thompson then shared information about the METRO Blue Line Extension, as well as multi-modal transportation and a history of light rail transit (LRT) versus bus rapid transit (BRT), and the Transitway Advancement Policy and enterprise risk.

Council members had questions and comments regarding the scope of the agreement with regard to current and future projects, the amount of relief provided to the counties, specific funding amounts, the timeline and obstacles of the Kenilworth Trail, sales tax revenue, flexibility and usage of federal funds and sales tax revenue, and stability of 5307 funding. Council members also discussed the METRO Green Line Extension condo dispute, enterprise risk and the Transitway Advancement Policy, lack of benefit to the rest of the region with the agreement, the impact of this agreement on funding decisions for future projects, and

transparency and timing of decisions.
