

# 2013 THRIVE PHASE II ROUNDTABLES SUMMARY OF AGRICULTURE COMMENTS

# **KEY MESSAGES**

- Clearer articulation of authorities and policies about agriculture are needed in Thrive.
- Agriculture is a productive industry with specific needs, not a holding strategy for future urbanization.
- \* Large-scale and small-scale agriculture are distinct sub-industries.

#### **Ideas & Themes**

- Look at more ways to encourage farmland preservation.
- Local food production and distribution can be an economic, health and resiliency strategies.
- Seek a balance between local control and regional action to protect and nurture agriculture.
- Need for better analysis of uses that compete with agriculture for land positives and negatives.

### **Quotes & Observations**

- "Farm land should be protected the same as natural resources once it is gone, it is gone!."
- "Keep development within existing MUSA boundaries FIRST. Preserve existing rural land as a natural resource that contributes to a healthy local food supply.."
- "A vibrant local food system is food security...we, as people, cannot live without food. We can live without parks, roads, etc.."
- "Met Council should help locals decide which way to go—ag preserve or pro city/development."

## **Unique /Innovative Approaches Suggested**

- Create a farm advisory committee in the Met Council—just like transportation advisory committee, etc.
- Local food systems support the economy and quality-of-life in both rural agricultural areas and urban centers through co-ops, farmers markets, CSAs, and other .
- Add "food systems" as a Met Council authority similar to transportation or parks.
- "Basic health care: <u>food</u>! Locally grown in season."
- Local food production to feed the metro area. Plan for this as part of planning for growth.
