

2013 THRIVE PHASE II ROUNDTABLES SUMMARY OF COMMENTS ON REGIONALLY SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC PLACES

KEY MESSAGES

- Global competitiveness will require an active strategy by the region that builds on our strengths and coordinates action between cities, businesses, regional and state partners.
- Maintaining both hard and soft infrastructure is key to supporting and attracting industry and residents.
- Coordination is a great role for the council to play. Someone has to hold the whole vision together.

Ideas & Themes

- Make industry visible, tell its story. Need to make industry more transparent; educate people on how important it is!
- Need to link transportation investment strategies with significant economic place strategies.
- Need to link education strategies with significant economic place strategies.
- Business voices should be heard more in the decision making both large and small business.

- "Housing may take care of itself if you get the jobs right."
- "The river should be put to greater use economically, utilized to fullest potention."
- "The Met Council could practice economic gardening" to cultivate conditions to help businesses survive."

Unique /Innovative Approaches Suggested

- The Council should build on its data resource capabilities to plug into economic development.
- Develop a map of key sites in the region that are prepared for development/redevelopment. Show who is ready to support an industry and where.
- Establish business commissions in cities, to get business voices in the policy process.
