

Economic Competitiveness - 2014

- Sub-regional economic, workforce and real estate research
 - Localize industry sectors the drive the regional economy
 - Analyze occupations & workforce characteristics geographically
 - Identify key sector occupations with career ladders accessible to economically disadvantaged populations
 - Identify real estate requirements of key industry clusters
 - Identify availability of development & redevelopment sites to meet growth & infrastructure needs of economic drivers
