Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

1. Release the draft 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program;

- 2. Authorize a public hearing to be conducted regarding the draft 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program at 4:00 p.m. on August 17, 2015 as part of the Community Development Committee meeting;
- 3. Keep the public record open until 5:00 p.m. on September 1, 2015;
- 4. Direct staff to publish public hearing notices and distribute copies of the draft 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program for public comment under the Council's administrative procedure for public hearings;
- 5. Direct staff to submit the 2016-2017 portion of the draft 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program as part of the Metropolitan Council's Preliminary 2016 State Bond Request to Minnesota Management and Budget; and
- 6. Require Dakota County, Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board, and Three Rivers Park District to submit specific project descriptions in priority order for the draft 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program to the Metropolitan Council no later than August 17, 2015.

Background

MN Statutes Section 473.147, Subdivision 1 requires the Metropolitan Council, after consultation with the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission (MPOSC), municipalities, park districts and counties in the metropolitan area to prepare and adopt a system policy plan for regional recreation open space as part of the Council's development guide. The law also requires the Council to include a multi-year capital improvement program (CIP) in the parks policy plan, which should be revised periodically, and to establish criteria and priorities for the allocation of funds from the capital improvement program. The CIP must be considered through a public hearing process as part of the 2040 Regional Parks Policy Plan.

The draft 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program proposes:

1. Spending \$18.33 million every 2 years for capital improvement projects that are consistent with the Metropolitan Council-approved regional park and trail master plans.



- 2. Funding the CIP with \$11 million of State bonds and \$7.33 million of Metropolitan Council park bonds every 2 years (2016-17, 2018-19 and 2020-21).
- **3.** Allocating the \$18.33 million among the ten regional park implementing agencies is based on a formula in the *2040 Regional Parks Policy Plan*:
 - 70% of the money (\$12,833,000) is allocated based on each park agency's percent of the region's population.
 - 30% of the money (\$5,500,000) is allocated based on each park agency's percent of all non-local visits to the regional parks system

The 2016-2017 portion of the 2016-2021 Regional Parks CIP is the basis for requesting \$11 million of State bonds for consideration by the Legislature in 2016. A <u>preliminary</u> request for the State bonds must be submitted by June 12, 2015 to Minnesota Management and Budget. The <u>final</u> request for the bonds must be submitted by October 16, 2015.

The 2016-2021 Regional Parks CIP is a part of the Metropolitan Council's Unified 2016-2021 CIP along with CIPs for Environmental Services and Transit. The Unified 2016-2021 CIP and the 2016 Unified Capital Budget is prepared in the late summer of 2015 and adopted in early December 2015.

The Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission (MPOSC) considered the business item at its meeting on June 2, 2015. Based on public comments made at the meeting, MPOSC amended the proposed action to require Dakota County, Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board, and Three Rivers Park District to submit project details to the Council by August 17 so this information would be available at the public hearing, and asked staff to evaluate extending the public record to allow sufficient time for public comments on the proposed projects. Staff recommends keeping the public record open until September 1, 2015, rather than the originally proposed date of August 27. The amendments to the proposed action are underlined in the first section of this staff report.

Rationale

Preparation and funding of the 2016-21 Regional Parks CIP is authorized by State laws (MN Statute 473.147 and MN Statute 473.325). The 2016-17 portion of the Parks CIP is the basis for requesting State bonds to finance 60% of the CIP. The State bonds are matched with Metropolitan Council bonds to finance 40% of the CIP.

Funding

The funding proposed for the 2016-20 21 Regional Parks CIP is \$11 million of State bonds matched with \$7.33 million of Metropolitan Council bonds for each 2 year period of the CIP. Grants are awarded for projects in the 2016-17 Parks CIP when the funds are appropriated for those projects.

Known Support / Opposition

The Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission (MPOSC) unanimously recommended approval of the amended proposed action at its meeting on June 2, 2015. There is no known opposition to setting a public hearing date for the 2016-2021 Regional Parks Capital Improvement Program.

The 30% of \$18.33 million is allocated based on the park agency's percent of all non-local visits. The combined allocation from both factors in the formula is highlighted in yellow.

A <u>preliminary</u> request for the State bonds must be submitted by June 12, 2015 to Minnesota Management and Budget. A <u>final</u> request for the bonds must be submitted by October 16, 2015. The final request will be based on the results of the public comment process.

The 2016-2021 Regional Parks CIP is a part of the Metropolitan Council's Unified 2016-2021 CIP along with CIPs for Environmental Services and Transit. The Unified 2016-2021 CIP and the 2016 Unified Capital Budget is prepared in the late summer of 2015 and adopted in early December 2015.

Table 3 depicts the 2016-2021 Regional Parks CIP Preparation Timeline, which meets the deadlines for submitting a preliminary and final 2016 State bond request, and aligns with the schedule for preparing the Council's Unified 2016-2021 CIP.

A <u>preliminary</u> request for the State bonds must be submitted by June 12, 2015 to Minnesota Management and Budget. The <u>final</u> request for the bonds must be submitted by October 16 2015. The final request will be based on the results of the public comment process.

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Grants are awarded for projects in the 2016-17 Parks CIP when the funds are appropriated for those projects.

Regional Parks System Management Structure

The organizational structure of the Regional Parks System is unique. It is built upon a strong partnership among the Council and several governmental agencies, including cities, counties, and special park districts. While each agency has a role in the Regional Parks System, collaboration is the cornerstone and the strength of the Regional Parks System.

Metropolitan Council Role

Regional Parks System legislation directs the Council to take the leading role in providing for a Regional Parks System that will complement the recreational open space opportunities provided in the area by the federal, state and local units of government. State law gives the Council the authority to determine which parks and trails in the seven-county area are included in the Regional Parks System and to generally identify areas that should be acquired for the Regional Parks System. The Council is charged with determining whether these lands are regionally important and would collectively provide a balanced system of outdoor recreation for the region.

The Council also contributes and administers funding to the regional park implementing agencies to acquire, develop and operate the Regional Parks System.

Regional Park Implementing Agencies Role

Cities, counties, and special park districts own and operate regional parks and trails. The agency partners that own and operate the Regional Parks System are called regional park implementing agencies. A map of the regional park implementing agency areas is shown in Figure 1-1.



Park Agencies submitted to the Metropolitan Council proposed projects to be funded from their allocation for each 2-year period of the CIP. The proposed projects must be consistent with Metropolitan Council-approved master plans for the park or trail where the project is located.

Projects are listed in priority order. If less funds are appropriated to fund the CIP, each park agency allocation would be reduced proportional to its share of the CIP. For example Anoka County's share of the CIP is 10.02%. Anoka County would receive 10.02% of the appropriated funds, and projects would be funded in priority order.
