# 2016-241 Project Based Voucher Award Recommendations

HRA Manager Terri Smith presented the report to the Community Development Committee. It was moved by Chávez, seconded by Munt, that the Metropolitan Council approve proposals for Project Based Voucher (PBV) assistance and authorize staff to execute necessary documents with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the owners of the projects to assign a total of 30 Vouchers in six (6) projects as follows:

The Community Development Committee had questions regarding the Project Based vouchers vs Tenant Based vouchers. Also, discussed the challenges voucher holders face with the current low vacancy rates. Ms. Smith stated some client are not able to use their vouchers, even with extensions.

Chair Cunningham suggested voucher holders could be considered a "protected class".

2016-242 2016 Livable Communities Demonstration Account Grant Recommendations

Apple Valley Mayor Mary Hamann-Roland, Chair of the Livable Communities Advisory Committee (LCAC), and Senior Planner Ryan Kelley presented information on the 2016 Livable Communities Demonstration Account (LCDA) program, process, and each of the projects being recommended for funding. The Community Development Committee was presented with two funding options as described in the Business Item.

It was moved by Letofsky, seconded by Dorfman, that the Metropolitan Council (1) authorize the transfer of \$175,000 remaining from the LCDA-TOD Pre-Development Program to the regular LCDA program, (2) award nine Livable Communities Demonstration Account grants, as follows, and (3) authorize its Community Development Division director to execute the grant agreements on behalf of the Council:

Committee members Letofsky, Wulff, Dorfman, and Elkins volunteered to join the work group.

Chair Cunningham thanked the city of Inver Grove Heights for the use of their City Hall chambers. Community Development Division Director Beth Reetz invited the committee members to the upcoming PlanIt conference on December 13<sup>th</sup>.

Chair Cunningham announce the MUSA discussion from the October 19<sup>th</sup> Community Development Committee meeting will be continued at the December 5<sup>th</sup> Community Development Committee meeting.
