## **Current situation**

- Projects are usually appropriated funding through legislative action
  - Capital Improvement Program (CIP; even years) or
  - Parks & Trails Legacy (odd years)
- No bonding bill was enacted in 2016 to fund the regional parks CIP
  - Two bonding bills currently under consideration at the Legislature
    - Governor's bill: \$10M
    - Alternative bill: \$5M
  - Fate of the bonding bills may not be known until late
     May

## **Current situation**

- Some projects arise off-cycle and need special consideration
  - Opportunities for cost savings or economies of scale
  - Land acquisition opportunities that may be lost
  - Emergencies
- These exigencies are addressed through a mechanism known as future reimbursement consideration



### Future reimbursement consideration

## 2040 Regional Parks Policy Plan requirements:

- To be eligible for future reimbursement consideration, the agency must obtain formal Met Council approval prior to beginning work on the project
- The Agency undertakes the project at its own risk and pays for it from its own funds
- The Agency <u>may</u> be reimbursed from Council bonds through the Agency's share of a future Capital Improvement Program
- This instance further complicated due to uncertainty of bonding bill status




## Future reimbursement consideration

#### This instance:

- Safety: Mitigate a public health emergency by connecting to City of Andover water because of a contaminated well that supplies the Visitor Center at Bunker Hills Regional Park
- Economy: Connect to city sewer at the same time
- Timing: Site well water is non-potable



## Regional Park System Anoka County



# Two funding scenarios

- If a bonding bill is enacted in 2017 and if Anoka County's share is sufficient to cover the project
  - Anoka County will fund the project through the normal bonding process and will not be eligible for future reimbursement consideration;
  - Anoka County will cover all costs incurred prior to the state bonding eligibility date
- If a bonding bill is not enacted in 2017 and if the Council approves this request
  - Anoka County will complete the project using its own funds
  - Anoka County may request up to \$250,000 in reimbursement through a future CIP, but
  - The Council does not guarantee reimbursement



## Rationale

- MN Stats §473.315 authorizes the Council to award grants for metropolitan regional parks
- The 2040 Regional Parks Policy Plan authorizes the Council to reimburse Agencies for the costs of development projects undertaken before they can be financed through the CIP
- The recommended action aligns with Thrive MSP2040
  - Supports the Stewardship outcome by protecting the public health & providing safe drinking water
  - Supports the Collaboration principle by working with Anoka County outside the typical funding cycle



## Recommendation

- Consider reimbursing Anoka County up to \$250,000 from its share of a future CIP for costs incurred to connect the Bunker Hills Regional Park Visitor Center to city water and sewer, UNLESS a state bond appropriation is enacted during the 2017 legislative session and Anoka County's share is sufficient to cover the cost of the project
- Inform Anoka County that the Council does not under any circumstances represent or guarantee that reimbursement will be granted, and expenditure of local funds never entitles a park agency to reimbursement.
