## Background

When Livable Communities Act grant recommendations are presented, the focus is on the projects recommended for funding at that time. This presentation will take a look at the cumulative awards during this Council's tenure to date and will cover some of the outcomes envisioned and realized. We will also highlight a few of the projects funded.

# **Thrive Lens Analysis**

Livable Communities Act funding currently addresses the Thrive outcomes in many ways, including: Stewardship:

"Leveraging our infrastructure investments with higher expectations of land use."

• LCDA and LCDA-TOD grants, in particular, help fund land acquisition and public infrastructure that increase densities, and provide a mix of uses and housing affordability and types.

### **Prosperity:**

"Planning for and investing in infrastructure, amenities, and quality of life with an eye to what the region needs to be economically competitive"

- LCDA and LCDA-TOD grants help fund infrastructure and placemaking features that help create livable neighborhoods, and provide workforce housing in proximity to job centers and transit "Encouraging redevelopment and infill development across the region"
- LCA accounts and grant categories help participating communities implement projects in priority sites, that further their comprehensive plan community development and redevelopment objectives Equity:

"Using our influence and investments to build a more equitable region."

 Livable Communities grants help provide employment, housing and transportation opportunities "Investing in a mix of housing affordability along the region's transitways."

 LCA grants help provide a mix of housing types and affordability levels connected to transit and jobs. Livability:

"Providing housing and transportation choices for a range of demographic characteristics and economic means."

 LCA grants, assist with the production and preservation of housing and transportation choices. "Aligning resources to support transit-oriented development and walkable, urban places."

 An early initiative of the current Council was the creation of the TBRA and LCDA TOD grants. Sustainability:

"Promoting the wise use of water through expanding water conservation and reuse, increasing groundwater recharge, and rebalancing surface water and groundwater use."

• Many of the LCDA, LCDA-TOD, and TBRA-funded projects have included water conservation and re-use features, as well as provisions to protect water quality.
