

What is Moving to Work?

- Federal program designation
- Allows public housing authorities (PHA) to create innovative, locally designed strategies in providing housing assistance.
 - Gives PHAs exemptions from many program rules and regulations
 - Provides flexibility in how federal funds are used
- There are 39 MTW agencies
 - 3,300 PHAs nationally
 - Minneapolis Public Housing Authority (MPHA)





Moving to Work (MTW) Flexibilities

Minor Administrative Changes

Complete New Business Models

- Simplify rent calculation
- Ease administrative process
- Simplify medical deductions
- Implement triennial recertifications
- Use alternative inspection process
- Eliminate cap on project-based vouchers
- Award project-based vouchers opportunistically instead of competitively

- Develop new partnerships
- Develop new programs
- Implement work incentives with service provisions
- Exclude certain income sources
- Develop landlord incentives
- Change affordability limits
- Waive or expand 12-month stay requirement for project-based vouchers



Moving to Work (MTW) Potential

- The 2016 Consolidated Appropriations Act includes language authorizing the HUD Secretary to expand existing MTW designations to adjacent agencies.
- Proposal submit a formal request to HUD to approve a Regional Moving to Work designation for the MPHA and the Council.
- Any regional designation must:
 - Achieve greater cost effectiveness reduce costs
 - Increase housing choices for low-income families
 - Help residents make progress toward economic self-sufficiency



Considerations

- Submitting request does not commit the Council to anything
- Goal is for collaboration to cover a full range of regional strategies while maintaining independent governance and operating structures.
 - Expand housing choice and mobility options
 - Create efficiencies in service delivery
 - Shift focus from administrative process to family success
- Would include public process and agreements between agencies



Next Steps

- Submit formal request to HUD by end of August
- Connect with congressional representatives for support
- If approved by HUD:
 - Obtain formal Council approval
 - Develop a Moving to Work Plan
 - Engage with the public, voucher holders and communities
 - Collaborate with educational and research institutions
 - Enter into an Agreement with MPHA
 - Details of the partnership



Action

• That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) to make a formal request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to have the Minneapolis Public Housing Authority's Moving to Work Program designation extended to the Council's HRA.
