Administrative Plan

- Policy document for Housing Choice & Project Based Voucher Programs
 - Program regulatory requirements
 - Metro HRA discretionary policies
 - PBV award criteria
- Must be approved by the Council
 - Generally approved as part of the Public Housing Agency Plan Process
 - Current version approved September 27, 2017

PBV Award Process

- Historically, PBV regulations required a housing authority to competitively offer and award PBVs
- Recent regulation changes allow more flexibility
- Regulations now allow a PBV award without a competitive process
 - <u>When</u> a project was previously awarded other government funding that was subject to a competition
 - Example = tax credit awards



Proposed Policy Changes

- Recommending a policy revision to acknowledge this regulation change
 - The PHA will accept proposals on an ongoing basis from owners that were competitively selected under another federal, state or local housing assistance program.
 - The PHA may directly contact specific owners that have already been selected under a previous competition.
 - Proposals will be reviewed on a first-come first-served basis.
 - Proposals will be evaluated using the existing award criteria.



Proposed Policy Changes

- Existing award criteria remains unchanged with one exception
 - Owner experience
 - Poverty deconcentration
 - Promote projects located outside of Areas of Concentrated Poverty where at least 50% of the residents are people of color <u>unless the</u> project is preserving an existing subsidy to help maintain affordability.
 - Increase the supply of affordable housing
 - Integrate housing and tenant services
 - Encourage economic integration
 - Promote linkages among housing, jobs and transportation
 - Community Support
