
Proposed Changes for 2019

- Smaller jobs projects will be eligible and competitive with applications for Tax Base Revitalization Account grants
- Local Housing Incentive Account (LHIA) funds will be available for suballocator-only proposals
- Modifications to eligibility for land acquisition for Livable Communities Demonstration Account (LCDA) and LCDA-Transit Oriented Development
- Refinement to engagement, jobs & design evaluation
- Threshold criteria for Transit Oriented Development applications eliminated

Equity Advisory Committee Questions

Staff sought ideas for how to:

- Better recruit representatives from community-based organizations to the Livable Communities Advisory Committee
- Encourage effective and early neighborhood engagement on projects by cities and developers
- More effectively align the Livable Communities scoring criteria with the principles of the Equitable Development Scorecard







Equity Advisory Committee Recommendations

On the Livable Communities Advisory Committee:

- Reduce time commitment by dividing obligation among more committee members representing community-based organizations - Would increase representatives of community-based organizations from 2 to 4 members
- Compensate members representing community-based organizations
- Use Urban Scholars or other fellowship program as a means to compensate members representing community-based organizations
- Equity Advisory Committee is willing to help us recruit committee members Implementation of these changes will emerge later in 2019.





Equity Advisory Committee Recommendations

On community engagement in project proposals:

- Clarify Council expectations about why we value effective community engagement
- Ask more questions in the application about community demand and community need





Equity Advisory Committee Recommendations

- State or clarify the connections between the values represented in the scorecard and outcomes expected as a result of grants
- Recognize the importance of accountability (Intent versus Impact) for proposed outcomes
- Consider how grant investment may lead to regenerative or sustained growth in wealth for community members

Funding levels

- Local Housing Incentives Account: \$2.5 million
 - Statutory base funding: \$1.5 million
 - Propose adding \$1 million in existing fund balance
- Livable Communities Demonstration Account:
 - Propose regular program funding: \$7.5 million
 - Propose TOD program funding: \$5 million
 - Requires budget amendment to transfer in existing fund balances






Tax Base Revitalization Account BalanceAvailableTBRA Funding Available by Year

Proposed Funding Amount for 2019:


- Statutory base funding: \$5 million

- Total: Up to \$6.9 million








Tax Base Revitalization Account Transit-Oriented Development Awards

Outside TOD areas Inside TOD areas












Tax Base Revitalization Account Funding Level Options






TOD Eligible Areas

 The D Line will be eligible for development grants


Planned Transitways Alignments




LCA-TOD Grant Areas
