








Mississippi Gorge Regional Park

- Approximately 265 acres of land and 5.5 miles of riverfront, from Central Mississippi Riverfront to Minnehaha Regional Park
- Great River Road and Grand Rounds National Scenic Byways
- Mississippi National River and Recreation Area






Development Concept

- 3. Parkway and trail recommendations


Overall Master Plan approach


- Balance park and recreation opportunities with protection, preservation and restoration of natural resources and river ecology

- "Southeast Flats" Area









Proposed Action
