Council Unified Budget

Capital Program

 Multi-year plan that represents authorized and planned projects. Current capital program is 2019-2024.

Authorized Capital Program (ACP)

 Multi-year authorization for projects where funding has been secured and the Council has given final approval to proceed.

Capital Budget

 Represents the amount from the Authorized Capital Program that is expected to be spent in a given year. We are currently in capital budget year 2019. This budget is amended throughout the year.

Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

 Six-year plan for projects where funding sources have been identified but not yet secured and the Council has not given final approval.


Regional Parks System Serves

- 56 regional parks & park reserves totaling more than 54,000 acres
- 8 special recreation features
- 49 regional trails, with nearly 400 miles of interconnected trails



Revenue Assumptions

- Legacy
 - 2% annual growth
 - 2020 base year ~\$20M
- Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund (ENRTF)
 - No growth
 - \$0.75M annually
- State of Minnesota Bonds
 - No growth
 - \$15M in bonding years
- Council Bonds
 - Up to \$40M outstanding
 - Match \$2 to every \$3 ENRTF and State Bonds






- Grant programs are funded by multiple state sources and Council bonds

Parks Capital Program - \$389 M











Future Spending - \$293 M






