

## **2008 Passage of the Legacy Amendment**

In 2008, Minnesotans passed the Clean Water Land and Legacy Act, funded by a 3/8 percent increase in the state sales tax

> Cultural Heritage Fund, 19.75%





Outdoor Heritage Fund, 33%



## Parks and Trails Fund

- Guided by the Parks and Trails Legacy Plan: A 25-year long-range plan for Minnesota
- Funding may flow through three implementing agencies:
  - -Greater Minnesota Regional Parks and Trails Commission
  - -Metropolitan Council on behalf of the ten Regional Park Implementing Agency Partners
  - Minnesota Department of Natural Resources

# **Parks and Trails Legacy Fund:**

- Supports parks and trails of regional and state significance
- Council disburses 100% of Metro funding to ten Regional Park Implementing Agency Partners by statutory formula

Minn. Stat. § 85.53

Funding Formula for Metropolitan **Regional Parks System** 

Set aside for land acquisition 10.0%

Non-local visits 13.5%

> Population 31.5%

Previous year's share of total O&M funding 45.0%



# **2012 Funding Agreement**

- First two biennia (2010-2013) challenging at Legislature
- 2012 Consensus Funding Agreement
  - -40% State Parks and Trails
  - -40% Metropolitan Regional Parks and Trails
  - -20% Greater Minnesota Regional Parks and Trails
- This Agreement has been in place for four biennia (2014-2022)

# Laws of Minnesota 2019, First Special Session Chapter 2, Article 3, Section 3(h)

- Establish a nine-member working group to develop consensus recommendations for the future allocation of the parks and trails (Legacy) fund
  - -Three representatives from each of the three parks and trials systems -Consult with the Parks and Trails Legacy Advisory Committee -Work Group shall develop a consensus recommendation by June 15,

  - 2020
  - -Present recommendation for fiscal years 2022 and 2023, with the possibility of extension in future biennia
