

Major Responsibilities



Provide coordinated planning and policy to guide the growth and development of the region.



Partner with regional park implementing agencies to plan for and fund the **Regional Parks System.**



Provide technical assistance to local governments to implement region policy in their local plans.



Facilitate community collaboration.





Deliver state and federally funded rent assistance to create and provide affordable housing for lowincome households.



Provide Livable Communities Act grants to help clean up polluted sites, expand housing choices, and build developments that connect housing, jobs, and services.



Identify, analyze, and report on issues of regional importance.












Regional Parks Grant Programs

Program	 Funding Source Distribution Methodole
Operations & Maintenance	StateFormula
Parks & Trails Legacy	 State matched by Count Formula
Parks Acquisition	 State matched by Council 1st come 1st served
Bonding	 State matched by Count Formula
Equity	 Council bonds Competitive




- Over 160 active grants valued at ~\$140M
- ~\$389M in the current Parks Capital Program (authorized + planned projects)
- Council approves scoring criteria for competitive grants



Livable Communities Grant Programs

- Three Primary Programs:
 - Tax Base Revitalization Account (TBRA)
 - Local Housing Incentive Account (LHIA)
 - Livable Communities Demonstration Account (LCDA)
- Grants competitively awarded; Council approves scoring criteria, funding levels above base
- Over 180 active grants valued at ~\$85M
- Over \$24 million to be awarded in 2020






Metro HRA

- Rising Housing Costs
 - Federal funding not keeping up
 - Can no longer lease to all families within funding provided
- Administrative Deficit
 - Prorated federal revenues do not cover the rising cost of staffing this work
- Tight Rental Market
 - Less units available for voucher holders
 - Landlords opt out of program participation
 - Rising rents
- COVID-19
 - Average per family subsidy payments rising
