Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the Community Development Director to execute grant agreements for FY21 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund projects and execute amendments to add FY21 funds to FY20 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund grant agreements.

Background

Parks and Trails Legacy Funds were appropriated to the Council for State Fiscal Year (SYF) 2020 and 2021 during the 2019 legislative session. SFY21 funds were authorized by the Council through the July 2020 budget amendment.

Grant agreements are required for the Council to pass through dollars to Regional Parks Implementing Agencies and Council action is required for the Community Development Director to execute agreements over \$500,000.

Legacy funds are distributed to Parks Implementing Agencies based upon a formula set in <u>Minn. Stat.</u> § 85.53, subd. 3. Data elements to complete the Legacy allocation formula were finalized on July 9, 2019 and Council staff are actively working with Parks Agencies to finalize which projects will be funded with SFY21 Legacy dollars.

A master list of projects to be funded with SFY2020 and 2021 Legacy dollars was developed according to State statute and Council policy. Attachment 1 lists projects currently eligible to be fully or partially funded with SFY21 Legacy dollars. These projects have been reviewed and recommended by the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission and were approved by the Council on October 24, 2018 via *Business Item 2018-261*.



Rationale

This action will allow the Community Development Director to execute agreements for eligible projects after Parks Agencies make a final determination of projects to fund with SFY21 Legacy funds.

Thrive Lens Analysis

Regional Parks funding from State appropriations advance Thrive outcomes of Livability by enhancing the quality of life in the region through increasing access to nature and outdoor recreation.

Funding

Projects are funded with State Parks and Trails Legacy funds and are included in the 2020 July Unified Budget Amendment, Business Item 2020-182 JT.

Known Support / Opposition

Regional Parks Implementing Agencies and the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission support these projects. There is no known opposition.
