





2023 Fund Distribution Plan

As part of the Fund Distribution Plan, the Council approved up to \$2,000,000 for LCA Pre-Development grants to be awarded in two application rounds with \$1,000,000 available in each funding opportunity.



New Generations LLC

City of Brooklyn Center

Recommended Award: \$231,000

- 30% AMI housing with supportive services targeting veterans
- Includes workforce center for tenants and wider community
- Provides youth-led coffee shop and youth-centered programming



Hamm's Brewery

City of St. Paul

Recommended Award: \$275,000

- Adaptive reuse and densification for parts of former Hamm's Brewery
- Includes a range of affordable housing including rental and ownership opportunities
- Features an arts & cultural marketplace and placemaking elements




The LOMA

City of Minneapolis

Recommended Award: \$150,000

- Creates affordable housing for target populations and provides on-site supportive services
- Offers neighborhood-scale commercial spaces



Rodeo Plaza

City of Minneapolis

Recommended Award: \$150,000

- Redevelopment of damaged site in downtown Longfellow
- The development includes affordable housing and neighborhood-scale commercial spaces to serve community needs




Rice Street Gardens

City of Maplewood

Recommended Award: \$150,000

- The project will include housing ownership and affordable rental opportunities
- The development has been informed by extensive engagement and advances community priorities including preservation of a community garden




Affordable Commercial SLP

City of St. Louis Park

Recommended Award: \$44,000

- The development will provide long-term affordable commercial spaces that will be targeted to support limited income entrepreneurs.
- The project will bring more intensity to the site and provide neighborhood-serving businesses and job opportunities


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
