- 18% percent of residents live near light rail or BRT
- 93% of workers have access to a vehicle
- 2023 median household income is \$124,000









Regional Household Distribution

Number of total households in the region




Region's Low-Income Households

Share of region's households that are 50% AMI or less




Share of region's households that are 50% AMI or less and cost burdened

Unemployment

- White residents: 3%
- Black residents: 7%
- Indigenous residents: 9%

Homeownership Rate


- White households: 74%
- Black households: 25%
- Indigenous households: 41%

Cost Burden

- White households: 44%
- Black households: 57%
- Indigenous households: 60%


Regional Transit and Job Centers

- Regional Job and Activity Centers
 - 1000+ jobs
 - 10 jobs/acre
- Transit Station Areas
 - 20% of households live within a half mile of a high frequency transit station



Environmental Justice

Annual average fine particulate matter (micrograms per cubic liter)




Areas of Environmental Concern

- Air pollution
 - 91% of households of color have air pollution risks above health guidelines
- MPCA Environmental Justice Areas include areas with high percentage of people of color or people living below the poverty threshold




Total Residential and Commercial Permits 2020-2022



Total Residential and Commercial Permitted Units 2020-2022




Total Affordable Residential Permitted Units 2020-2022

New affordable housing region-wide by area median income (AMI)




The Area Median Income (AMI) for the 15-county metro area was \$118,200 for a family of four in 2022. Other four-person AMI levels:

- 30% AMI at \$35,200
- 50% AMI at \$70,380
- 60% AMI at \$62,940



Awarded LCA Grants from 2020-2022


173 Awarded Grants 2020-2023

- More than 30 cities awarded grants
 - Scattered site projects not represented
- More than \$79,000,000 dollars awarded

Top 10 Net Beneficiaries of LCA per capita

Awards 2020-2022

- 9 out of 10 are under the regional median net tax capacity
- Only 3 of these cities are on track to meeting their Allocation of Affordable Need for units at 30% AMI or less
