# Equity Grant Program Background



- Purpose: to provide funding to Regional Park Implementing Agencies for projects to advance equitable use of the Regional Parks and Trails System, with a focus on race, ethnicity, income, ability, age, and/or national origin.
- 2019 Pilot Program
  - Funded 3 of 15 applications for capital projects for a total of \$300,000
- 2021 Program
  - Funded 23 of 37 applications for a mix of capital and non-capital/programming projects for a total of \$2,054,000



# 2024 Applications and Review Process



- 8 of 10 Regional Park Implementing Agencies submitted applications
- 22 applications submitted, requesting \$2,165,500
- Available funding: \$2,068,000
- Technical review committee scored the applications and met on March 1<sup>st</sup> to develop funding recommendations
  - Members from the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission, the Community Development Committee, and Implementing Agency staff
- All 22 applications are recommended for funding, with 2 projects receiving partial funding, for a total of \$2,055,500

# Takeaways from the Review Committee



- While agencies submitted fewer projects for this 3rd grant cycle, it seems that the projects are more refined and prioritized
- All projects have merit and are worth funding; some of the lower scores might reflect the application more than the project itself
- A lot of support for water safety and drowning prevention projects, glad to see 3 agencies submit for these
- Would like to see more engagement with schools; schools could make excellent partners with most of these projects
- More than half of the projects are programming efforts for entire agency districts, rather than focused at one park or trail
- Need to add language in the Notice of Funding Availability clarifying whether or not this program supports expanding or continuing to fund existing programs
- Find a way to incentivize agencies to work together so it doesn't take away from their individual project ideas (i.e., doesn't count towards their funding limit)
- Presentation to the Committee of the Whole after the current grants close

# Rationale for recommendation

The *2040 Regional Parks Policy Plan*, Finance Chapter 8, Strategy 4 states that equity is a consideration in the Regional Parks System funding and investment. The equity grant program is one key Council strategy for advancing equity in the region.

# Recommendations

## That the Metropolitan Council:

1. Approve funding 22 projects totaling up to \$2,055,500 for the Regional Parks and Trails System 2024 Equity Grant Program, as shown in Table 1 of this report.
2. Authorize the Executive Director of Community Development to execute the grant agreements and associated amendments on behalf of the Council.
