Transit Oriented Development

TOD Policy

Promote moderate to high density development projects located within walking distance of a major transit stop that typically include a mix of uses such as housing, jobs, restaurants, shops, and entertainment.





2024 Fund Distribution Plan


As part of the Fund Distribution Plan, the Council approved:

- \$5,500,000 of funding for LCDA-TOD Development grants
- Award Limit of \$2 million per city applicant
- Only eligible in TOD Areas


Funding Recommendation



- Mixed-use new construction

- Commercial space and financial services




Opportunity Site Public Infrastructure

City of Brooklyn Center

Recommended Award: \$2,000,000

- Component of the Opportunity Site redevelopment
- Area-wide stormwater system and multimodal parkway through site
- 498 housing units at 76 jobs created



Rise Up Center

City of Minneapolis

Recommended Award: \$500,000

- Workforce development center focused on working with residents of color
- Training in green and clean energy fields
- Capacity to train 3,000 residents annually



Indigenous Wealth Building Center

City of Minneapolis

Recommended Award: \$500,000

- Multi-use office, commercial, coworking, and event space
- LEED certifiable building design
- Expand only Native CDFI in Minnesota



Hamm's Brewery: East End

City of Saint Paul

Recommended Award: \$1,500,000

- Affordable housing with 31 deeply affordable units
- Large family-sized units included
- Public art designed by local artists
