- Deeply affordable housing targeted to youth experiencing homelessness
- Includes comprehensive services and workforce training

City of Hopkins

Recommended Award: \$892,000

- Phius certified housing development
- 40-unit infill development




Hamm's Brewery Redevelopment

City of Saint Paul

Recommended Award: \$750,000

- 86 units of mixed-income artist housing with amenities for artists
- Part of larger brewery redevelopment including housing, commercial space, and public space amenities



Valley Station Apartments

City of Apple Valley

Recommended Award: \$808,000

- 144 units, 25% 3bedroom units for families
- Partnership to provide rent support and credits building for residents



Arts & Amenities at The Heights

Saint Paul Port Authority

Recommended Award: \$1,800,000

- 1,000 units of mixedincome housing, including affordable homeownership opportunities
- 718 new living wage jobs



Zaria

City of Minneapolis

Recommended Award: \$1,600,000

- 90 affordable units, with 5 3-bedrooms units affordable at <30% AMI
- 29 units affordable at <30% AMI
- 14 units for High Priority Homeless and people with disabilities




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1345 Central

City of Minneapolis

Recommended Award: \$600,000

- 64 units of affordable housing for families making <50% AMI
- 7 units for High Priority Homeless and 5 for people with disabilities
- Ground floor space for a local small business



Hadley Ridge Apartments

City of Cottage Grove

Recommended Award: \$785,000

- 164 units of mixedincome housing, most 2 or more-bedroom units
- Partnership to provide rent support and credits building for residents



ACER Shingle Creek Redevelopment

City of Brooklyn Center

Recommended Award: \$900,000

- 12 rental spaces for local businesses
- ACER offices and services, including workforce development and community services



Blooming Meadows South

City of Bloomington

Recommended Award: \$2,000,000

- Preserving 306 units of affordable housing in developing area
- Building-wide upgrades to roof, elevator, and other systems in addition to in-unit upgrades for residents



Lincoln Avenue Communities

City of Columbia Heights

Recommended Award: \$1,500,000

- 248 new construction affordable units, including 22 four-bedroom units
- Reducing impermeable surfaces at former corporate campus



Larpenteur Avenue Senior

City of Falcon Heights

Recommended Award: \$432,500

- Mixed-income senior housing development, including 12 units for residents making <30% AMI
- On-site clinic and other services



99 County Road B

City of Little Canada

Recommended Award: \$432,500

- Mixed-income senior housing development, including 11 units for residents making <30% AMI
- 11 units for High Priority Homeless residents




