Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council amend Section 2 of Park Grant SG-2012-096 as follows:

2. Grantees Duties or Grant Project.

The Grantee, who is not a Met Council employee, will:

At Fish Lake Regional Park, reconstruct paved roads, parking lots and trails; and at Cleary Lake Regional Park, reconstruct paved roads, parking lots and trails.

Background

Grant SG-2012-096 is financed from Three Rivers Park District's share of FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriations. The \$2.15 million grant's current scope is to reconstruct paved roads, parking lots and trails in Fish Lake Regional Park. The estimated cost of the Fish Lake project has been revised and is now estimated to be \$1,786,330. The Park District has submitted a request to expand the scope of the grant to allow the estimated balance of \$363,670 to reconstruct paved roads, parking lots and trails at Cleary Lake Regional Park.

Rationale

The proposed change in scope of this grant is consistent with the conditions of section 9.2 of the grant agreement. The Metropolitan Council must consider and approve the proposed grant scope change because it is a substantial revision to the grant agreement. The existing grant agreement states:

9.2 Amendments. Any amendment to this grant agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant contract, or their successors in office.

Funding

Grant SG-2012-096 is financed with Three Rivers Park District's share of the FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation to the Metropolitan Council.

Known Support / Opposition

The request is consistent with the requirements of section 9.2 of grant SG-2012-096. There is no known opposition to the request. On March 12, 2013, the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission unanimously approved the recommendation.

Background

Rationale

The Metropolitan Council must consider and approve the proposed grant scope change because it is a substantial revision to the grant agreement. In order to consider this request for a change in scope of the grant, Section 9.2 of the grant agreement states:

9.2 Amendments. Any amendment to this grant agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant contract, or their successors in office.

The proposed change in scope of this grant is consistent with the conditions of section 9.2 of the grant agreement because:

1. Three Rivers Park District has submitted a written statement to the Council describing the situation and giving reasons for the change in scope, as shown in **Attachment 1**.

2. The change in scope of the grant is consistent with the Metropolitan Council approved master plans for Fish Lake and Cleary Lake Regional Parks.

Funding

Grant SG-2012-096 is financed with Three Rivers Park District's share of the FY 2013 Parks and Trails Legacy Fund appropriation to the Metropolitan Council.
