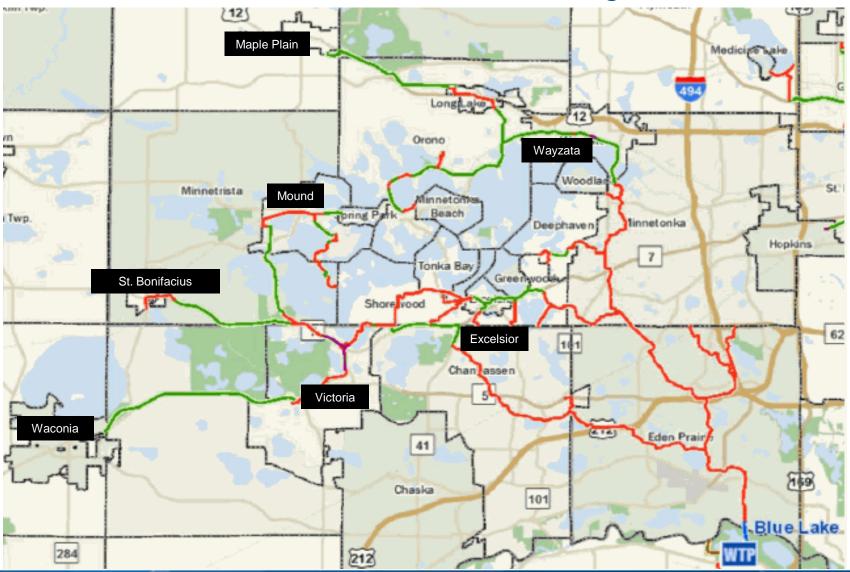

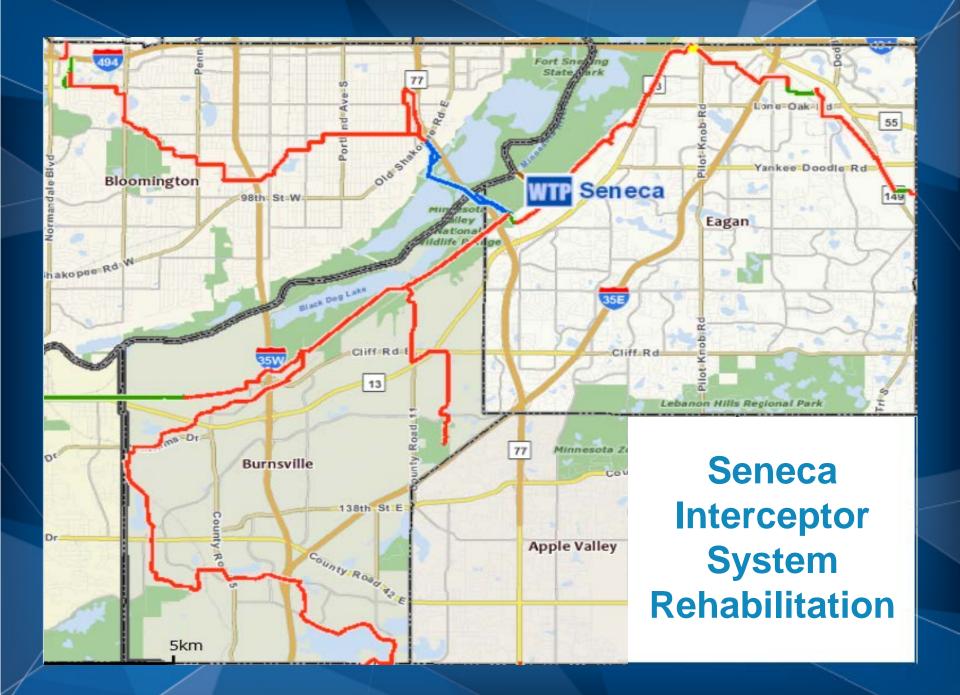

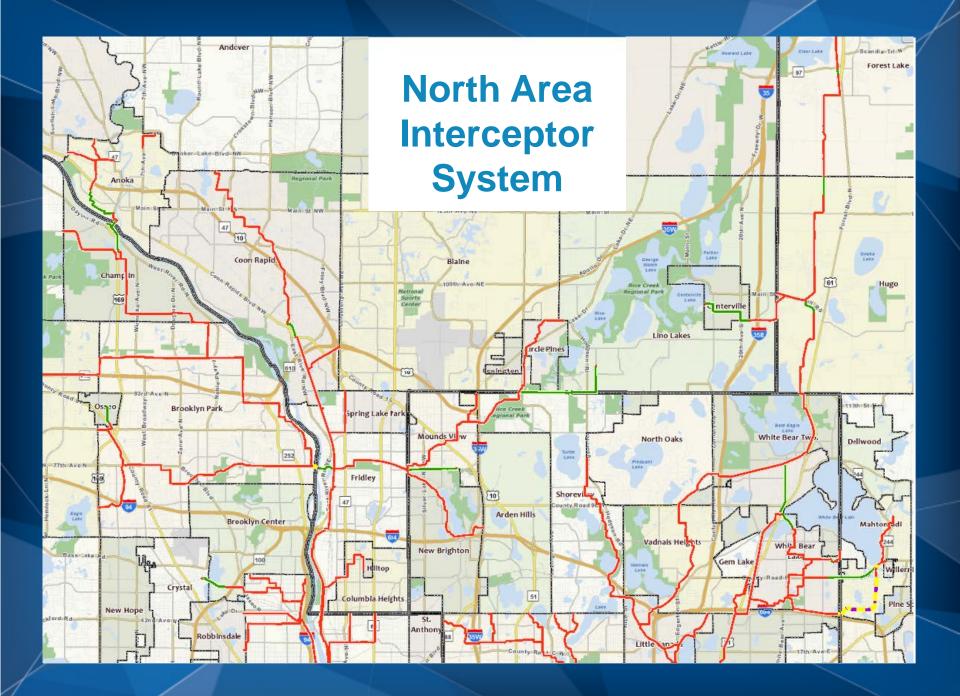

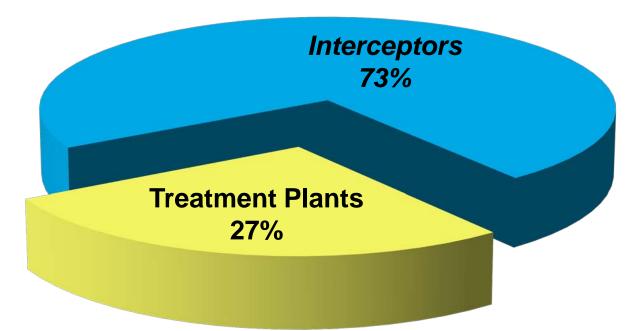




#### Minneapolis Interceptor Projects

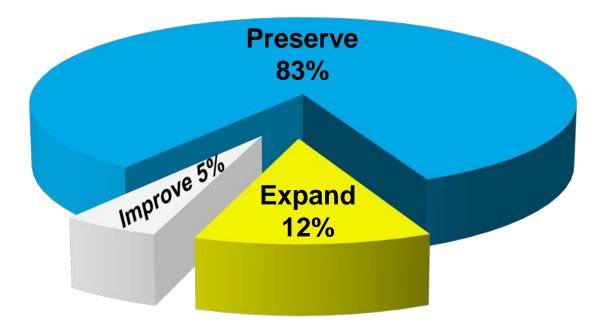


#### Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Cost Breakdown by Project Type

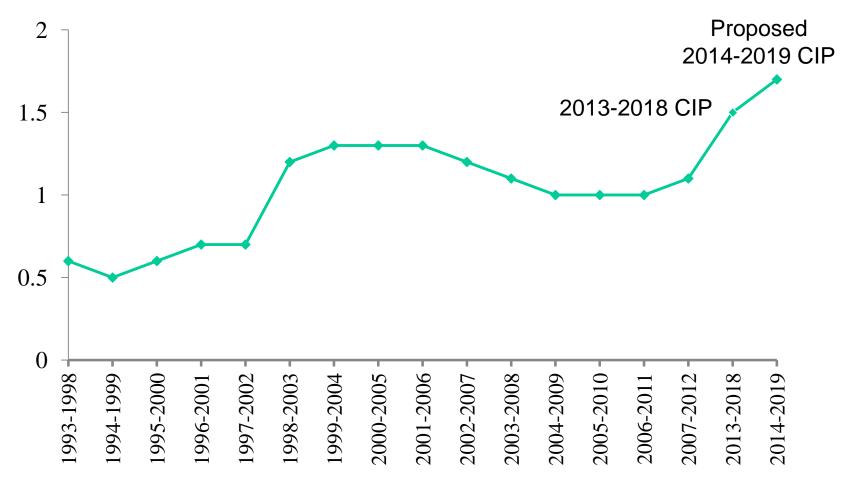
