Subject: Ratification of Emergency Declaration for Repair and Replacement of Mendota Forcemain

Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council ratifies the attached *Justification for and Declaration of Emergency* for repair and replacement of Mendota forcemain.

Background

MnDOT is improving the drainage system and resurfacing Highway 13 between Second Street in Mendota and I-35E in Lilydale. A forcemain spill along Interceptor 8360 was detected by MnDOT construction staff on Friday, July 10. MCES staff responded by shutting down the pipe flows and trucking flows from Lift Station L61 to a nearby discharge point while a temporary conveyance system is established. It appears the spill was contained on the site and what remained on the surface was recovered by our vacator truck.

Forcemain 8360 is needed to provide continuous wastewater service to the City of Mendota. Temporary measures are in place to keep service to the community; however a permanent and immediate solution is needed. There is a threat to public health from the wastewater pipe leak.

Highway 13 is currently closed due to the MnDOT project and will reopen in August 2015. A significant cost savings will accrue to replace the 1600 LF of pipe in conjunction with the ongoing road (Hwy 13) construction, as well as avoidance of a second future road closure.

MCES staff is evaluating the best option to repair the pipe. Currently, the design team is considering a localized spot repair, 1600 linear feet of cured in place pipe or 1600 linear feet of new forcemain pipe with costs up to \$1,000,000.

Rationale

Metropolitan Council has delegated authority to the Regional Administrator to declare an emergency on behalf of the Council when: (1) health, safety, or welfare of the public is compromised or potentially compromised and requires immediate action to correct; or (2) significant cost savings is immediately available through circumstances previously unknown and requires immediate action to take advantage of the situation. Both circumstances exist in this situation.

Currently, the design team is considering a localized spot repair, 1600lf of cured in place pipe, or 1600 lf of new forcemain pipe with costs up to \$1,000,000.</p>

Current count: 504 characters.</p> <p>Forcemain 8360, which serves the City of Mendota, cannot be used due to the pipe break. Based on the above information, an emergency situation exists within the meaning of the Council Procurement Policy. Carrying out the competitive bidding process and the technical requirements of the Council's Procurement Policy, and awaiting Council declaration of an emergency and approval for the purchase of materials or supplies or the making of emergency repairs would significantly and unacceptably delay the commencement of repair work on the above-referenced project. The Metropolitan Council, by its Procurement Policy, has delegated authority to the Regional Administrator to declare an emergency on behalf of the Council in such cases. Therefore, I declare on behalf of the Metropolitan Council, that an emergency exists as described above and that the emergency situation requires the immediate purchase of materials or supplies or the making of emergency repairs. I authorize the General Manager/Division Director named above to let appropriate contracts and make payments for the purchase of materials or supplies or the making of repairs necessary to meet the emergency situation without advertising for bids, without meeting other technical requirements of Council Procurement Policy, and without prior approval of the Council. If the costs to correct the emergency situation total \$100,000 or more, I direct that this emergency declaration and any such contracts and/or payments be presented to the Metropolitan Council for formal ratification at its next meeting.
