#### **25x25 Initiative**

Governor's goal: 25% improvement in Minnesota's water quality by the year 2025

- Board of Water and Soil Resources

### Why?


Governor Dayton would like to drive a clean water ethic in the state, bringing together all Minnesotans to address our water quality challenges with an ambitious, achievable goal.





#### What is the 25x25 initiative?


- 1. A call to action to provide flexible goals for each of Minnesota's eight local watershed regions
- 2. Individual regions (based on SWCD areas through the state) will decide what pollutants to address and strategies to deploy
- 3. No new regulations





#### **25x25 Initiative Process**

- Citizen engagement
- Compilation report of all gathered feedback
- Governor's Summit early next year
- Legislation and other initiatives proposed by governor in 2018





#### What does success look like?


- Each region defines the 25% improvement
- Strategic water quality policy initiatives proposed for 2018 session





## What is happening this year?

- Civic engagement
  - Regional activities
  - Citizens to work together to identify priorities
  - Create a shared vision of what a 25% improvement looks like
  - Develop strategies to get there

- Town Hall events
- Regional targeted meetings
- Locally organized meetings





#### **Example 25% Improvement Goals**

#### • 25% reduction in

- phosphorus levels in our lakes
- beach closures
- days when recreation is impaired by algae blooms
- road salt use
- water use
- 25% increase in
  - native vegetated buffers
  - agriculture lands in cover crops or perennial vegetation
  - number of private wells tested



## State Organized Town Hall Events

- 3 in the metro
  - Minneapolis- September 26
  - Burnsville- October 4
  - East Metro- October 5
- For the general public
- Brief presentations + small group discussion with state agency leadership
- Collect written input on 25x25 goals from participants



## State Organized Regionally Targeted Meetings

- Closely follow Town Halls
- With key allies, water professionals, interest groups
- Gather feedback on 25% goals and policy ideas



## Locally Organized Community Water Meetings

- Citizens and local governments host discussions
- Anyone can organize: faith groups, rotary clubs, neighborhood associations
- Access to regionally specific materials and a discussion guide online
- Submit information from the discussion guide online



#### Ways to Participate

- Attend Town Halls late September/early October
- Host your own community water meeting
  - Staff available to provide support
- Encourage others you know to host a community water meeting
