



Project Goals


- Demonstrate effective techniques for I&I mitigation

- Detail the cost-effectiveness of the mitigation strategy
- Provide technical assistance to communities

Flow reduction

- Identify sources of I&I
- Repair sewer to remove I&I
- Monitor flow before and after repairs
- Evaluate the flow reduction
- Report findings for other communities to use







Selection criteria

- Quality and Value 65% – How the project will benefit other regional communities
- Ability to complete on schedule 15%
- Effectiveness 10% Age of housing is a key indicator of potential for I&I Financial Need – 10%



Expected budget

- Flow monitoring, sewer repairs, evaluation, and reporting
- At least 50 percent of the project cost by community
- Grant is for \$500,000 to one community
