

Project Background (cont.)

Interim Service Plan vs. Long Range Service

Interim Plan

- Local system (minor improvements) to provide service to Loretto
- \$4.5 million
- Capacity for Loretto, current communities
 AND growth for +20 years

Long-Term Plan

 Construct "Ultimate" regional system when added capacity is needed.



Agreements

Loretto

- Construct facilities to connect to Independence System
- Loretto to be reimbursed for MCES meter installation
- Loretto to set aside land for regional lift station

Independence

- City reimbursed for O&M costs, up to 20 years
- MCES to install meter
- Agreement ends once regional system in place or determination that regional system no longer needed

Medina

- MCES to install 2000 LF pipe
- City reimbursed for O&M costs, up to 20 years
- Agreement ends once regional system in place or determination that regional system no longer needed
