## **Proposed Action**

That the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to award and execute a construction contract for Chanhassen Interceptor Rehabilitation 8253-328, MCES Project No. 802883, Contract No. 19P199, with Visu-Sewer, Inc. for their low responsive and responsible bid of \$3,690,537.25.

#### Background

The project consists of rehabilitating approximately 3,000 feet of concrete gravity sewer, ranging in size from 30-inch to 42-inch and installing eleven fiberglass manhole inserts. The project also includes rehabilitation of 1000 linear feet of 12" concrete gravity pipe owned by the City of Chanhassen under a cooperative construction agreement.

Four bids were received and opened on October 8, 2019. The bids ranged from \$3,690,537.25 to \$4,524,992.60. Visu-Sewer, Inc. submitted the low bid, which was less than the engineer's estimate of \$4,434,980.00.

The Metropolitan Council Underutilized Business (MCUB) goals for this project is 6% Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and 6% Women Business Enterprise (WBE). The low bidder, Visu-Sewer, Inc. has met the good faith effort goals as determined by the Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity.

## Rationale

Construction contract awards exceeding \$2,500,000 require Council authorization.

#### **Thrive Lens Analysis**

This action advances the Thrive Outcome of Stewardship. Public financial resources will be invested efficiently and effectively to maintain the existing wastewater infrastructure, which protects the region's natural resources.

#### Funding

Project No. 802883 is included in the 2019 MCES Authorized Capital Program and will be financed with general obligation bonds.
