2019 Program Overview

- \$500,000 available in 2019
 - For “shovel ready” redevelopment projects
 - Maximum grant amount: \$100,000
 - Minimum grant amount: \$10,000
 - Open to Metro Area Cities, Counties, Townships, Watershed Management Organizations, Watershed Districts, Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCD)
 - \$100,000 maximum per applicant
 - Cannot be combined with other Council grants
 - Council may offer partial funding to proposals
 - Projects must be completed by December 31, 2022

Received fifteen applications requesting a total of \$1,063,369
