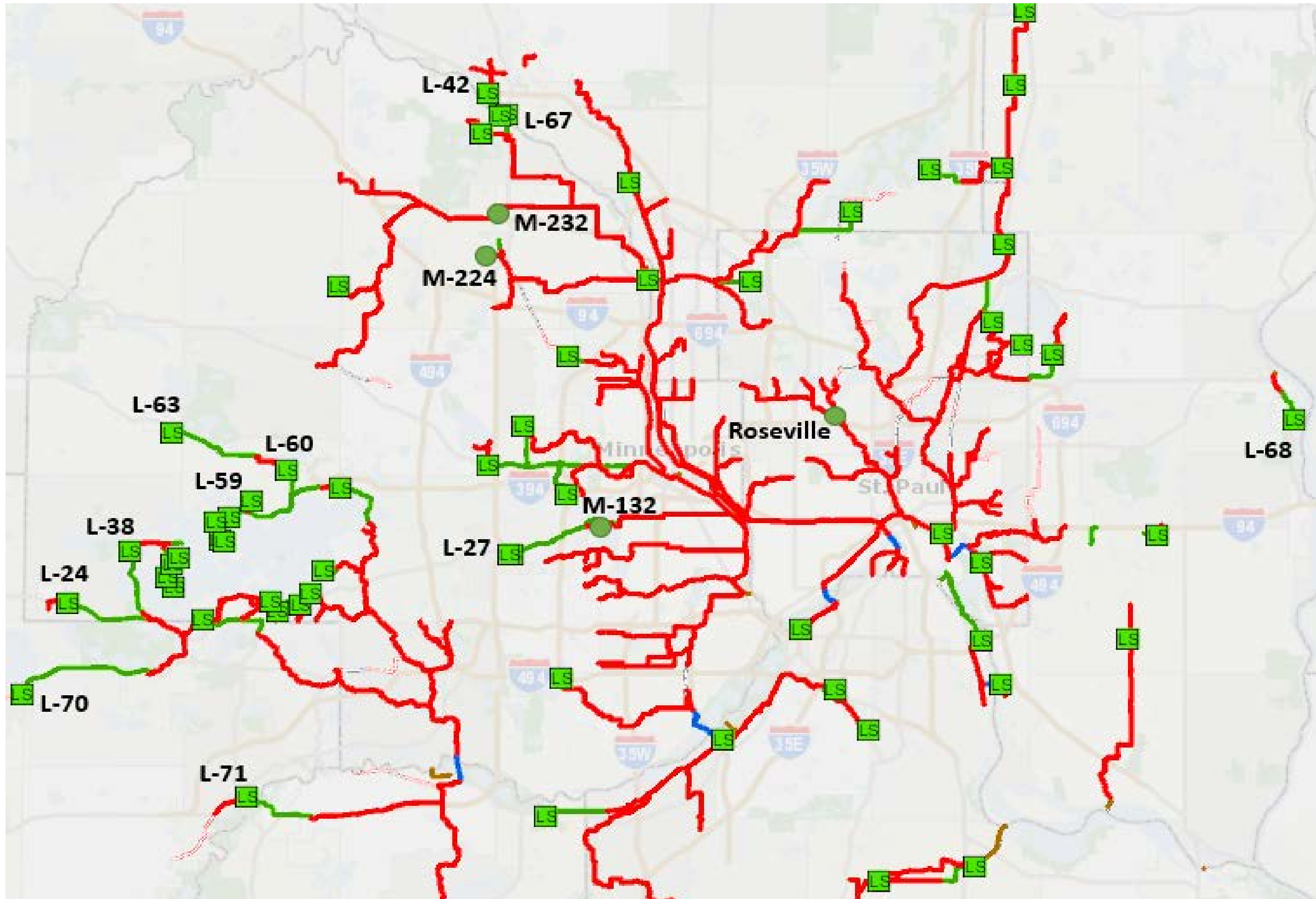

Background

- Evoqua installed and owns several chemical storage tanks and most delivery systems for odor and corrosion control in the regional interceptor system
- After evaluation, it was determined to be in the best interest of MCES to procure a new design, build, operate contract for odor and corrosion control services
- Current contract with Evoqua expires January 31, 2021
- Staff is working with OGC, Procurement, and OEO to finalize RFP
- To ensure continuation of services, it is recommended that the existing contract be extended 18 months
