






### 2022 Revenue Sources — \$323M (No changes from May 11 Environment Committee)






## 2022 Proposed Uses by Category – \$333M (No changes from May 11 Environment Committee)



#### Wastewater Outstanding Debt




#### Projected Debt Service Change

Annual Debt Service Increase / (Decrease)



#### Historical SAC Rate Increases (%)


