Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorizes a Public Hearing on January 5, 2022 to gather input on the draft Facility Plan for the Hastings Wastewater Treatment Plant, MCES Project No. 809800.

Background

This facility plan recommends relocation of the Hastings Wastewater Treatment Plant service from downtown Hastings to MCES property located at 2445 Ravenna Trail, Hastings, MN by 2026.

The 2040 Water Resources Policy Plan includes planned replacement of the existing Hastings Wastewater Treatment Plant to serve the long-term service area which may include land areas of Marshan, Nininger, and Vermillion Townships. The long-term planned capacity is 10 million gallons per day.

The existing plant site presents challenges to major renewal, land use compatibility, and expandability in response to reliable service issues, growth, and changes in regulatory requirements.

Based on a 2020 condition assessment, continued reliable service at the existing plant through 2040 will require an investment of approximately \$26,000,000. Cost does not include facility expansion or building systems upgrades. Relocation of the existing Hastings Wastewater Treatment Plant at this time avoids major investment at a site that does not meet the long-term needs of the service area.

Rationale

A public hearing is required for a draft facility plan prior to its adoption by the Metropolitan Council as a condition for obtaining project financing through the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority.

Thrive Lens Analysis

This action advances the Thrive outcomes of Stewardship and Sustainability by providing more capacity for development and investing in our infrastructure in an efficient manner.

Funding

Preliminary funds for the project's planning, design, and construction are included in the 2021 Capital Program. MCES intends to submit this project to Public Facilities Authority for inclusion in its 2022 Intended Use Plan.
