





MCES Maintenance Personnel Allowable Capabilities

MCES Maintenance Personnel Are Trained Competent Persons To Safely Erect Sectional Scaffold To The Following Heights

2' x 5' end sections, 2 scaffold levels high. (This results in a scaffold 2' wide and approximately 10' tall)

5' x 5' end sections, 3 scaffold levels high. (This results in a scaffold 5' wide and approximately 15' tall)

Scaffolding that is required to be erected higher than mentioned above must be contracted out to a licensed competent scaffolding contractor and comply with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.28 (Safety Requirements for Scaffolding)

Several MCES Maintenance Personnel are OSHA trained competent persons to do daily use inspections and tag scaffolding appropriately
