High Strength Waste Hauling

Proposed action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize its Regional Administrator to award and execute Contract 25P064 with Schlomka's Vac Truck Services, Inc. for hauling high strength waste from Kemps LLC to either the Empire or the Metropolitan Water Resource Recovery Facility in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000.

Background

Metropolitan Council high strength waste hauling services are required by agreement between the Metropolitan Council and Kemp's LLC, which has been executed under the Council-approved Industrial Pretreatment Incentive Program (IPIP).

The Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued on June 3, 2025. A pre-proposal meeting was hosted by Council staff on June 23, 2025 that outlined the solicitation requirements, discussed project specifications and responded to plan holder inquiries. There were fourteen (14) registered plan holders, ten (10) prime contractors, two (2) subcontractor, two (2) plan rooms, and four (4) of the plan holders identified as minority, woman, small, veteran, or disadvantaged business enterprises.

On July 8, 2025, the Council received three (3) proposals to be evaluated for the consideration of award. The evaluation panel consisted of Council staff. The criteria used to evaluate the proposals were: the quality of the proposal, the experience of the proposer, the qualifications of the proposer, and the price. The evaluation panel reached consensus that the proposal submitted by Schlomka's Vac Truck Service, Inc. provides the best overall value to the Council.

Rationale

The award and execution of non-construction services in excess of \$500,000 requires Council approval.

Thrive lens analysis

This action supports the Thrive outcome of stewardship as the work supports efforts to maintain

the region's wastewater treatment system.

Funding

Funding is authorized and available in the operating budget.

Small business inclusion
