Authorization to Hold a Public Hearing on the Draft Facility Plan for the Interceptor 8253-327 Forcemain Improvements Phase 2

Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize a public hearing to be held in December 2025 to gather input on the draft Facility Plan for the Interceptor 8253-327 Forcemain Improvements, Phase 2, ES Project No. 802806.

Background

Interceptor 8253-327 was constructed in 1988. This facility is a 3-mile-long 30-inch ductile iron pipe (DIP) forcemain. The system also includes a 700-foot-long 24-inch forcemain that functions as a limited-capacity backup. In 2021 and 2024, condition assessments identified sections of this interceptor as being in poor condition and in need of rehabilitation. In 2024 the final 2,000-foot section of the 30-inch DIP pipe was replaced. The proposed project will construct a new, fully redundant, 30-inch forcemain, rehabilitate the existing 30-inch interceptor 8253-327, and decommission the 24-inch pipe, within the communities of Shorewood, Victoria, and Chanhassen.

Rationale

A public hearing is required for a draft facility plan prior to its adoption by the Metropolitan Council as a condition for obtaining project financing through the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority.

Funding

Project 802806 is included in the 8028 family of projects in the 2025 ES Authorized Capital Program.
