
Project Background

Transportation Accessibility Advisory Committee (TAAC)

Purpose: Advises the Metropolitan Council from the perspective of people with disabilities

- Metro Transit
- Paratransit (Metro Mobility)
- Plans and Policies

Membership: 16 members - a chair appointed by the Council, seven members chosen by disability and senior groups in the metro area, and eight others selected by Council to represent 16 districts

- Innovated Metro Mobility public forum format
- Heavily influenced existing LRT station design



Land Use Advisory Committee (LUAC)

Purpose: provides advice and assistance to the Council on regional land use and comprehensive planning

Membership: 16 members and a chair. Each Council district is represented and locally elected officials make up at least half of membership

- Giving feedback on the Local Planning Handbook
- Recommending changes to the Council that influenced community designations in Thrive MSP 2040



Transportation Advisory Board (TAB)

Purpose: helps shape regional and state transportation plans

Membership: 34 members – includes county and city elected officials, citizens, transportation providers, and representatives of state and regional agencies.

- Provides a forum for deliberation among state, regional and local officials, transportation providers and private citizens
- Reviews and comments on the Thrive MSP 2040, the Transportation Policy Plan and other significant planning documents
- Solicits and evaluates applications for federal transportation funding

Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission (MPOSC)

Purpose: helps the Council develop a long-range plan and an acquisition and development program that includes funding priorities for regional parks.

Membership: 9 members - a chair appointed by the Council and eight members representing the 16 Council districts.

- 2014 study of regional parks use by communities of color
- Parks Equity Toolkit



Equity Advisory Committee(EAC)

Purpose: advises the Metropolitan Council in its work to advance equity in the metropolitan region.

Membership: 21 members – Co-chairs are selected by the Council. Eight district representatives and nine at-large members.

- Founding the committee, drafting bylaws and work plan
- Providing guidance on the 2017 Fare Increase Proposal



Changes Already Implemented

- Increased marketing and outreach efforts on vacancies
- Updated application form
- Interview everyone that applies
- Batching vacancies
