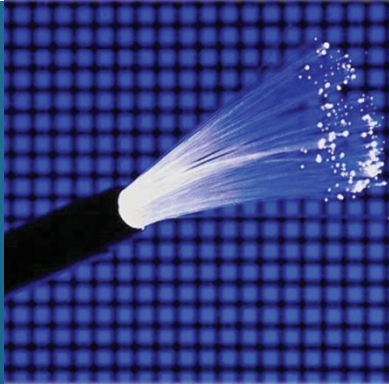

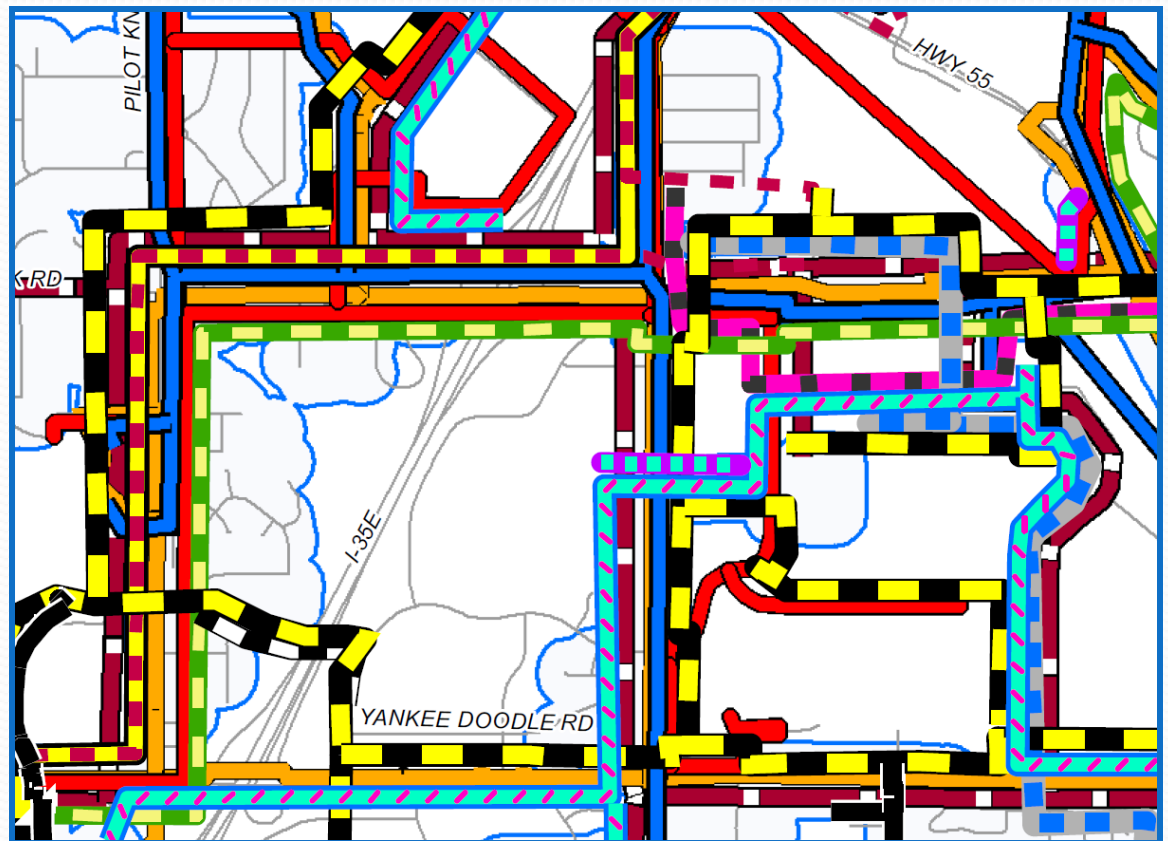

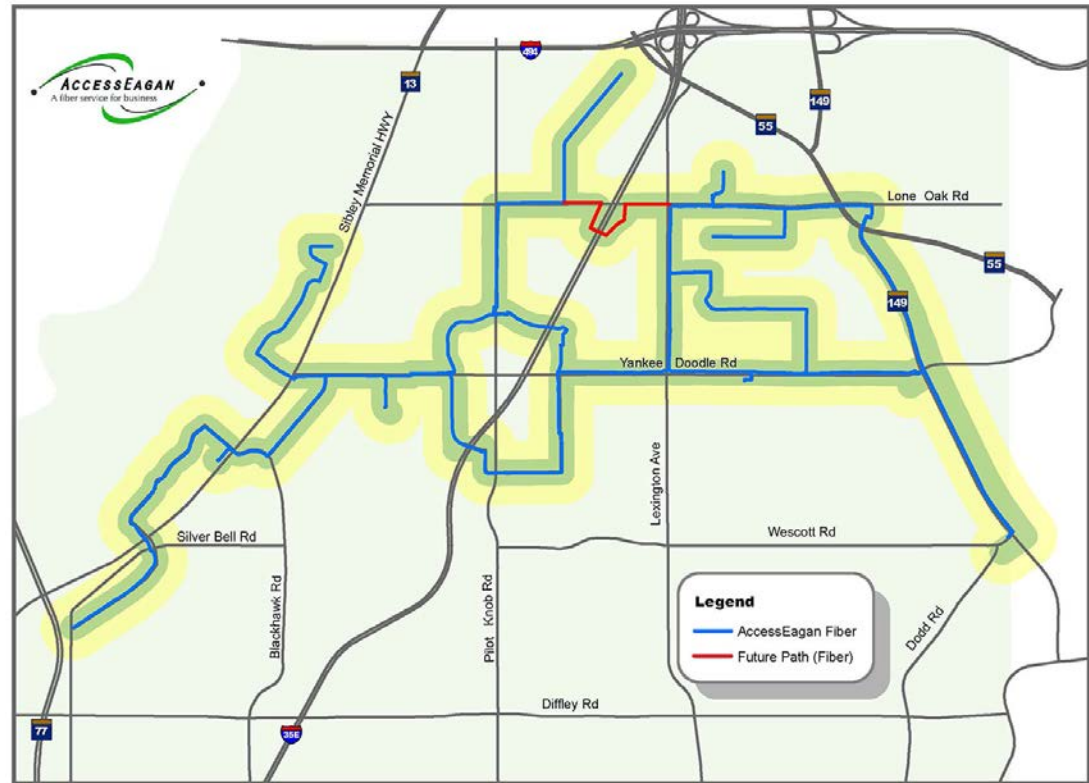
Eagan Strategies



- Working Group since 2004
- Carrier neutral
- Focus on Speed, Choice and Competition
- Solve problems, know the *needs*, know the *language*
- Improve continuously
- Strengthen the Region

AccessEagan

- 17.0 mile wholesale fiber network
- Open to any carrier that wants to serve Eagan businesses
- Carrier-class
- Cost about \$2 million paid from non-tax revenues.
- Network Availability Guarantee



Six providers so far



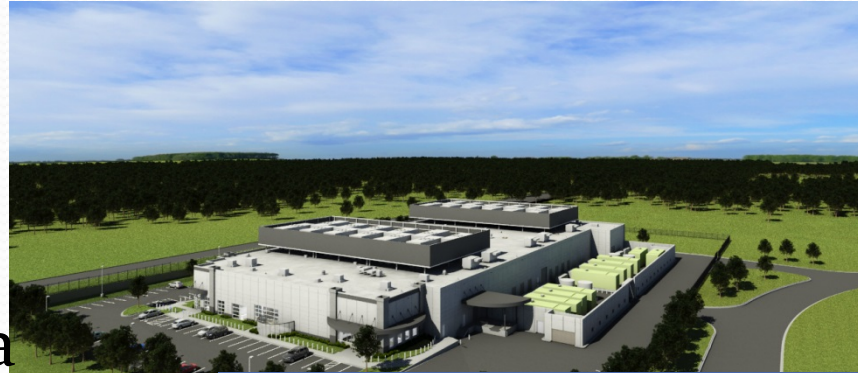
Impact

- AccessEagan fiber the only fiber into the new Twin Cities Premium Outlet Mall
- Nearby apartment complex has market attraction because of high bandwidth.
- Corporation enlarging its data center has 2nd pathway



Impact – Opened May, 2015

- In June, 2014, Dallas-based DataBank announces an 88,000 sq. ft. multi-tenant data center & carrier hotel

Lessons Learned

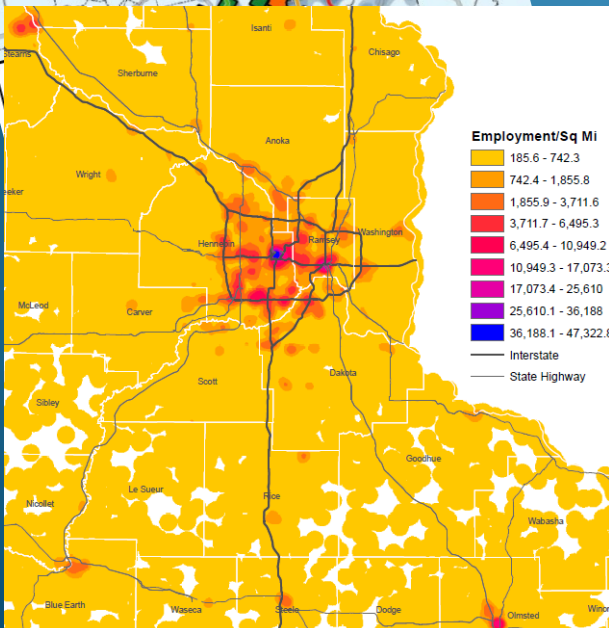


- Know the *needs*
