Background

- Sixteen members completed an online survey by January 6, 2020

- Do you have sufficient, some or no background information and knowledge to discuss each of seven topics?

- For topics with flexible timelines, what five topics are of greatest interest?

- What other topics would you add to the work plan?

Over 80% have sufficient or some background information and knowledge

System Statements

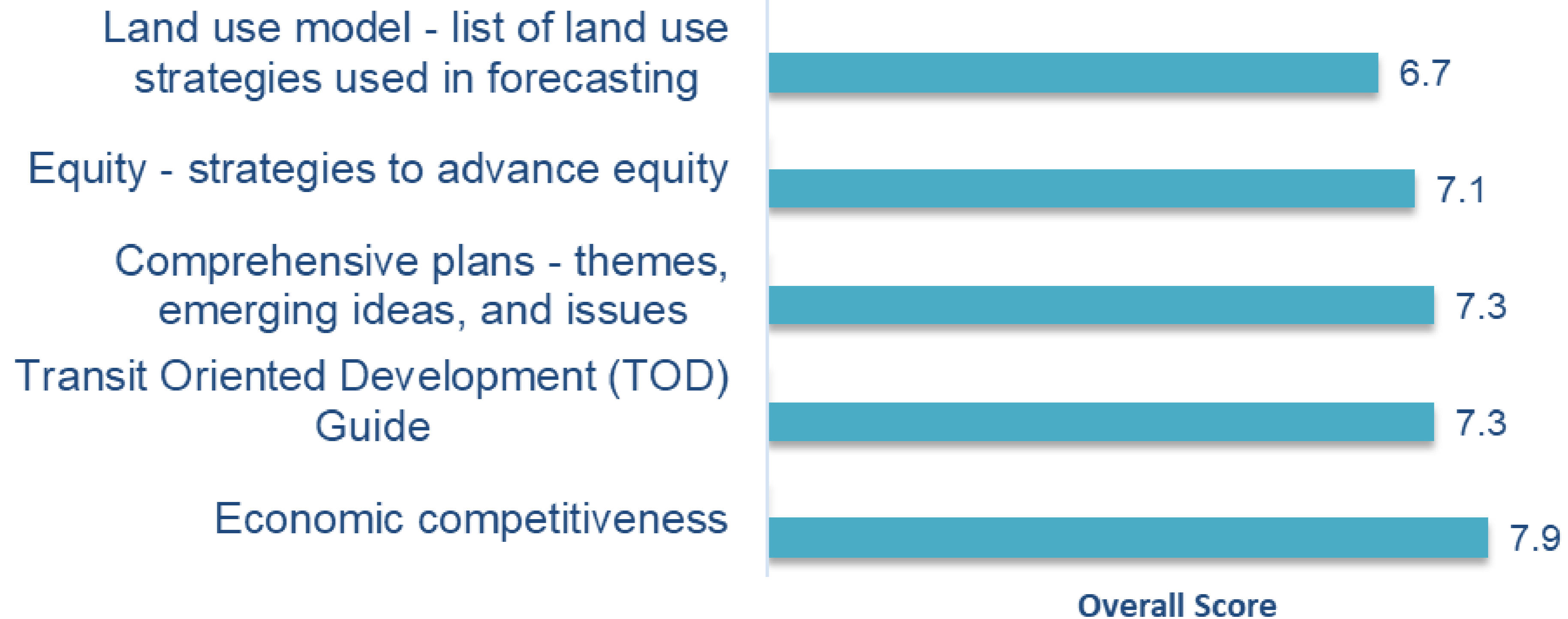
At least 50% have no background information or knowledge

Economic competitiveness

- Eight members ranked as first or second topic of greatest interest

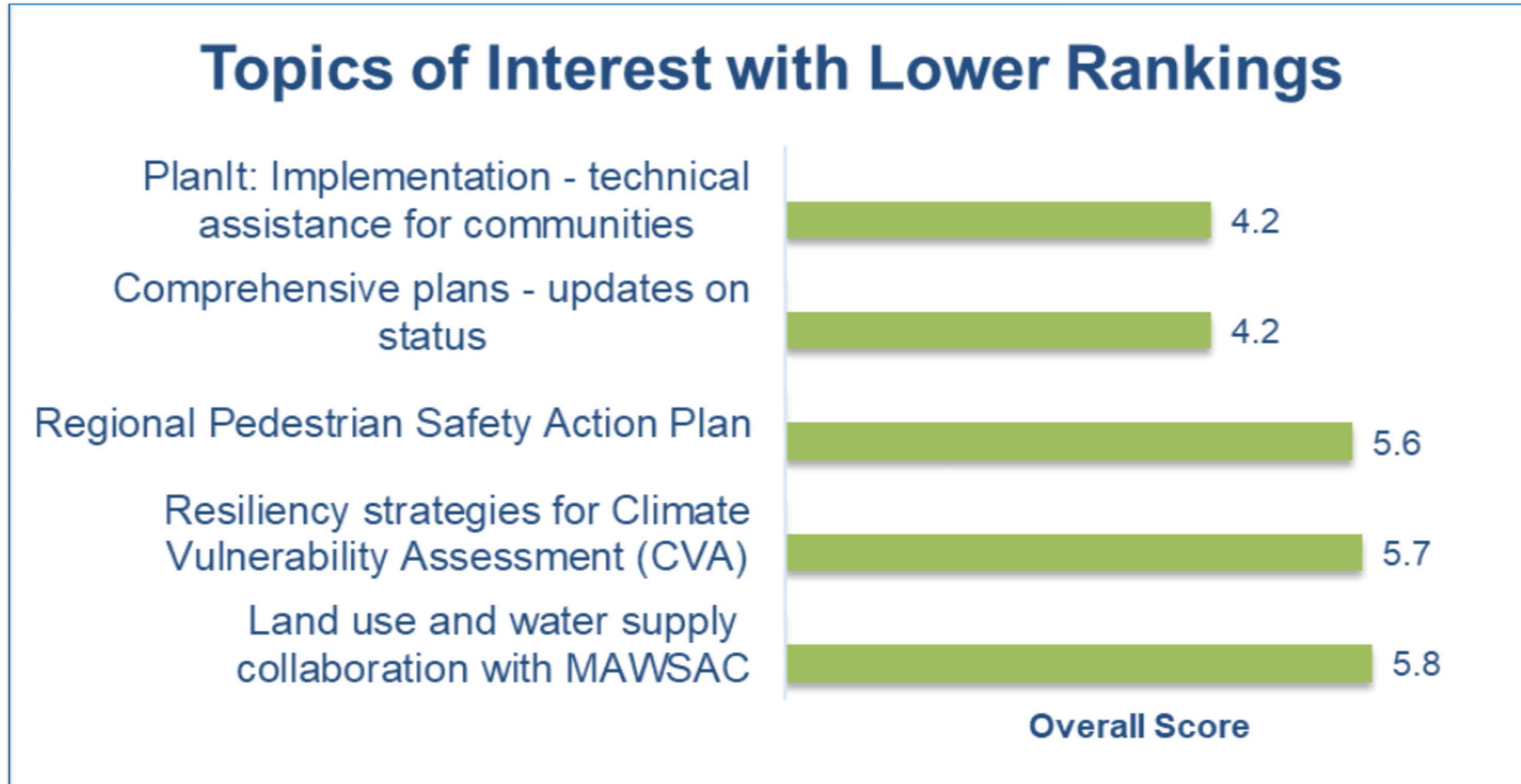
Comprehensive plans – themes, emerging ideas, and issues

- Six ranked as first or second topic

Equity – strategies to advance equity

- Five ranked as first or second

Topics with flexible timelines, continued



Ideas for topics to add

- Identify policy changes to increase affordable housing
- Transit - glaringly missing
- Working better with community to shape local policy
- Information on what other communities are doing
- Redevelopment in aging/built-out communities
- Engage new/emerging minority communities in public policy discussions and/or make small business ownership more understandable
- Active/closed landfills in communities and long-term goals of development and/or short-term goals if bonding restrictions prohibit development
- Community and environmental impacts of large-scale public infrastructure projects
- Lots of material to discuss here; if all topics get covered it would be great!
