Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council authorize the amendment of the 2013 Unified Capital Program as indicated and in accordance with the attached tables.

Background

This proposed amendment programs new federal, state and local funding to capital projects in the Transportation Division.

Metro Transit is proposing to increase its Authorized Capital Program by \$4.3 million, using federal, state and local funding sources. Metro Transit's proposed 2013 Capital Budget would increase by \$2.0 million.

Rationale

This proposed amendment programs available federal, state, local and regional funds to capital projects that allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement programs for transit and parks.

Funding

Funding for the amendment includes \$2 million in federal funding, \$2 million in state funding and \$300,000 in local funding from the Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority and the City of Minneapolis

Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council amend the 2013 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) and Authorized Capital Program (multi-year authorization) as indicated and in accordance with the attached table.

Background

This proposed amendment authorizes increases of federal, local and regional funding for new and existing projects as detailed in **ATTACHMENT 1**.

Increase Authorized Funding/Authorize New Projects:

Southwest LRT - Project #61001

This amendment recognizes a \$2,000,000 grant from the State of Minnesota (Department of Employment and Economic Development Grant) to finance a portion of preliminary, advance and final design of three bridge structures. This amount increases the State's funding commitment for SWLRT to \$44,000,000 toward its commitment of 10% to the overall SWLRT project budget. This project is identified in the CIP.

Northstar - Project #65510

This amendment recognizes \$2,000,000 of Northstar project Supplemental Contingency Funds for the purchase of on-board vehicle equipment, payment to BNSF for wayside improvements and the implementation of Positive Train Control. This was approved by the Metropolitan Council under Business Item 2013-5. These funds will be passed through by MnDot to the council from the Northstar FFGA with a subordinate funding agreement. This project is identified in the CIP.

New - Bottineau LRT - Project # 69304

This amendment recognizes \$150,000 in HCRRA (Hennepin County Regional Railroad Authority) funding for pre-project development staff expenses. This project is not identified in the CIP.

New - Nicollet Central Street Car - Project 69305

This amendment recognizes \$150,000 in City of Minneapolis funding for pre-project development staff expenses. This project is not identified in the CIP.

Change to Current Year Expenditures

Based on projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2013 Capital Budget is proposed to be increased by \$2,000,000 for Metro Transit.

Rationale

This amendment is required to authorize new funding for existing and new projects within the Transportation Division's Authorized Capital Program. These activities will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit.

Funding

This amendment provides \$2,000,000 in Federal funds, \$2,000,000 in State Funds and \$300,000 in Other funds from the Authorized Capital Program for transit projects.
