Proposed Action

That the Metropolitan Council:

• Amend the 2013 Authorized Capital Program (multi-year authorization) by increasing spending authority as follows:

Metropolitan Transportation Services

\$ 4,610,000

 Amend the 2013 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing appropriations as follows:

Metro Transit \$ 450,000

Approve the changes to capital projects as detailed in Attachment 1

Background

This proposed amendment programs new regional and local funding to capital projects. These projects are being brought to the Council outside the regular capital amendment schedule because of timing issues. The proposed amendment is being reviewed by the Management Committee before the Transportation Committee because the timing of committee meetings in January.

Metropolitan Transportation Services

Reducing Funding Commitments: None.

Increasing Funding Commitments: The proposed amendment increases funding and spending authority by a total of 4,610,000 on 3 projects. Funding for these projects includes \$4.16 million in regional funding and \$450,000 in local funding from the Counties Transportation Improvements Board and the Dakota County Regional Rail Authority.

Net Change in Authorization: \$4,610,000

Net Change to Current Year Budget: Based on the timing of projected expenditures, the 2013 Capital Budget is proposed to increase by \$450,000.

Rationale

This proposed amendment programs regional and local funds and increases multi-year spending authority. These capital projects will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit.

Funding

The proposed amendment decreases regional bonding for Metro Transit projects by \$2,438,668. There is available, un-programmed regional bonding authority provided by the Legislature to accommodate the additional bonding.

The regional funding included in this proposed amendment was reflected in the adopted 2013-2018 Capital Improvement Program and related fiscal analysis.

That the Metropolitan Council:

 Amend the 2013 Authorized Capital Program (multi-year authorization) by adding spending authority as follows:

Metropolitan Transportation Services \$ 4,610,000

 Amend the 2013 Capital Budget (annual appropriation) by increasing appropriation as follows:

Metropolitan Transportation Services \$ 450,000

Background

This proposed amendment authorizes local and regional funding for new and existing projects as detailed in **ATTACHMENT 1**.

Closing Projects/Reallocate Authorized Funding: None.

Reduce Authorized Funding: None.

Increase Authorized Funding / Authorize New Projects:

Cedar Avenue BRT - Marketing and Technology - Project #35909

This amendment authorizes an additional \$200,000 in DCRRA/CTIB funds to MTS for technology integration at the 28th Street and MOA Stations as part of the Cedar Avenue BRT project. While this Cedar Avenue BRT project component is not identified in the CIP, it has no fiscal impact on the Council.

2014 - MTS -Bus Replacement - Project #35912

This amendment authorizes an additional \$4,160,000 in RTC funds to MTS to restructure this project to allow for vehicle type changes and to acquire additional vehicles. This project will be used to acquire sixteen (16) thirty-foot replacement vehicles for the regional fleet.

This project is identified in the CIP.

Cedar Avenue BRT - Red Line Buses - Equipment and Technology - New 1

This amendment authorizes \$250,000 in DCRRA/CTIB funds to MTS for Automatic Vehicle Locator (AVL) and automated annunciator equipment for seven (7) Red Line station-to-station service buses. While this Cedar Avenue BRT project component is not identified in the CIP, it has no fiscal impact on the Council.

Change to Current Year Expenditures

Based on projected expenditures for the proposed amendments, the 2013 Capital Budget is proposed to be increased by \$450,000 for Metropolitan Transportation Services.

Rationale

This amendment is required to adjust existing funding and authorize new funding for existing and new projects within the Transportation Division's Authorized Capital Program. These activities will allow the Council to carry out its long-term capital improvement program for transit.

Funding

This amendment provides \$450,000 in Other Funds and \$4,160,000 in RTC funds from the Authorized Capital Program for transit projects.
