Unified Capital Improvement Program



- Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)
 - Six year forward look
 - Only planned projects
- Authorized Capital Program (ACP)
 - Council has given authority to proceed
- Capital Budget
 - Total expenditures authorized in the budget year
 - Projected cash-flow from the ACP
