

- Developer Constructs, owns, operates maintains solar garden.
- Subscriber Individual entities that purchase solar energy from developer.
- Utility Electrical provider where solar garden is installed.

As a leader in Renewable Energy, solar energy


- Has lesser climate, air, water impacts than grid power

Financial Benefit: Example



4 (1-MW) gardens produces about 5 million kwh/year

3% bill credit annual increase = **\$4.7 million savings** (over 25 years)
